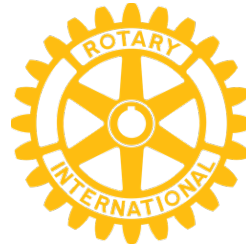

We should not live for ourselves alone, but for the joy of doing good for others, Arch C. Klumph, 1929. Rotarian Arch Klumph is best known as the father of The Rotary Foundation.

This past week we have had the honor of recognizing more of our members as Paul Harris Fellows! Presenting a Paul Harris Fellow Award is the Rotary Foundation's way of expressing its appreciation for a substantial contribution to its humanitarian and educational programs. It is named for our Rotary founder, a Chicago attorney, who, with three of his business associates, started the Rotary movement in 1905. The Rotary Foundation, founded at the suggestion of Arch Klumph in 1917, has distributed over 4 billion dollars through the years. The Rotary Foundation (TRF) allows Rotarians to address humanitarian needs by means of District Grants, Global Grants and its Polio Plus program. Our club has contributed more than \$640,000 since our inception.

For each \$1000 one contributes cumulatively, they are awarded a Paul Harris Fellow award. Currently, our club has **52 Paul Harris Fellow awardees**. With cumulative donations, members can achieve multiple Paul Harris Fellow awards, such as +2, +3 up to +9. After +9, you become a Major Donor with contributions of \$10,000 cumulatively, of which we have 4 members with this status. We have 2 members of the Bequest Society, contributing \$10,000 or more in your will or estate plan to TRF. And finally, we have one member who is an Arch Klumph Society member who has donated \$250,000 or more, cumulatively, to The Rotary Foundation.

Funds distributed by the Foundation in the form of grants, reflect the stated goals of Rotary including child and maternal health, environmental concerns, community and economic development, illness and disease prevention, peace building and conflict resolution, water related concerns and literacy and education. In the year 2022-2023, the Foundation donated over \$278,784,000 in grants for our areas of focus. Within District 6960, Rotary Clubs have used District Grants to fund hurricane recovery, food pantries, school literacy programs, Josh the Otter swimming safety training, among many others.

The Rotary Foundation is Rotary's number one means of financially reaching out to the world and the Foundation consistently scores four stars on Charity Navigator.

Please help us spread the word! The Sanibel Captiva Rotary club is pleased to announce the availability of several college/post-secondary scholarships as well as a Trade School scholarship for the 2024-2025 academic year. We like students who live or work regularly on the islands, or whose parents live or work on the islands, but it is not required. Students should be attending a college for an undergraduate degree or a vocational school. Strong academic performance and financial need are important components of our selection process. The awards are up to \$5,000/year and may be renewed for up to 4 years subject to maintaining at least a 3.0 GPA. Founder of Counseling for Community Wellness**



Dr. Bartley is a member of the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy (AAMFT), AAMFT Approved Supervisor, and AAMFT Clinical Fellow and maintains licenses in both clinical mental health counseling/supervision and marriage and family therapy/supervision in Ohio and Florida. She has presented nationally on topics including heart disease, family functioning and cardiac rehabilitation compliance, telecounseling, and compassion fatigue during and after a national disaster. Driven by the desire for mental health and wellness for all, she began Counseling for Community Wellness in response to the needs of our community to receive quality mental health counseling services along with the development of a supervision program that focuses on each beginning counselor to have a strong and supportive supervisor/supervisee relationship that encourages clinical growth. Her goal is to break down barriers to receiving quality mental health services with the collaboration of other community organizations
