Thomas E Addison – Manufacturing Executive

Tom Addison was born and raised a proud Buckeye in Columbus, Ohio and graduated from Ohio State University in 1962. Tom and his wife, Judy were high school sweethearts and married two years later when she graduated from Northwestern University. They celebrated their 58th Anniversary last month and are blessed with 3 daughters and 8 grandchildren.

After a year of Law School at OSU, he decided that business better fit his talents and interests and joined the JI Case company with headquarters in Racine, WI. and served in various marketing management positions in Canada and the US. While living in Racine, he joined Rotary which incidentally is the birthplace of Paul P. Harris, the founder of Rotary International.

In the spring of 1986, he found himself without a job but the opportunity to do what he had always wanted to do. In the Fall of that year, Tom and Judy incorporated Qualtech of Racine, Inc. and began manufacturing quality control support products which we marketed to manufacturing plants throughout the U.S. and eventually to the UK and Europe. It was a "from scratch" startup company, so they had many sleepless nights but in the end was the most exhilarating, fulfilling and terrifying thing he's done second only to raising their three daughters. After much soul-searching, they sold the business to a division of the Hubbell Corp in 2002 and began spending more time on Sanibel and traveling.

They are now year-round residents of Florida. Their church has always been the center of their lives wherever they lived and continues to be in Sanibel where he serves as Junior Warden at Saint Michael's Episcopal Church and at the downtown Ft Myers soup kitchen & other volunteer activities.

J.R. Pascall – Marketing – Business Intelligence Director

Before retiring on Sanibel, J R worked in the pharmaceutical industry for 18 years with Warner Lambert Park Davis and 10 years with IMS International Medical Statistics. For the Warner Lambert International Division he was Director of Business Intelligence and Strategic Planning. At IMS he was responsible for setting up IMS local business operations in eight countries: France, Germany, the U.K., Japan, the Philippines, Thailand, Indonesia, and Australia.

JR spent the first 10 years of his life in Beverly,, a small New England seashore town just north of Boston and Salem. He then moved with his family to Pasadena California for his high school years and then to Westwood where he attended UCLA, majoring in Business Administration.

His next move was to New York City to pursue his goal of a career with a Madison Avenue Advertising Agency. During his five years living in New York City he had the good fortune of working for and with two of the most iconic advertising executives of the 1950's, Bill Bernbach of Doyle, Dane and Bernbach who is probably best remembered for his award-winning "Think small!" ads for Volkswagen and David Ogilvy of Ogilvy, Benson and Mather for his "Man in the Hathaway Shirt" who also wore a monocle. Olgily was known as well for his Rolls-Royce ads "If you feel diffident about driving a Rolls then you can drive a Bentley!"

When JR moved to Sanibel for his retirement years he was keen to get involved with volunteer activities... He put the question to himself, "Based on my extensive and somewhat unique worldwide life experiences, where am best qualified to make a meaningful contribution to the Sanibel scene?" This led to the idea of his starting the Monday Night Film Series at BIG ARTS focusing on award-winning and critically acclaimed films of the entire world.



Friday's Speaker

This week will be John Silvia: The U.S. Economy - Where Do We Go From Here?



John Silvia recently launched a consulting firm following his retirement as Managing Director and Chief Economist for Wells Fargo which was a position that he held since 2002 prior to Wachovia's acquisition by Wells Fargo. John was awarded a National Association of Business Economics (NABE) Fellow Certificate of Recognition in 2011 for outstanding contributions to the business economics profession and leadership among business economists of the Nation. In 2010, he was recognized for the Best Inflation Forecast, the Best Overall Forecast and the Best Personal Consumption Expenditures Forecast by The Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago. John was named one of the Top 10 forecasters for the last four years by Bloomberg News in 2009 and the No. 2 forecaster by USA Today for 2008.

Prior to Wachovia/Wells Fargo, John worked on Capitol Hill as a senior economist for the U.S. Senate Joint Economic Committee and as a Chief Economist of the Senate Banking, Housing and Urban Affairs Committee. John has also served on economic advisory committees to the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland, the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland, and the Public Securities Association.

John holds a B.A. and Ph.D. degrees in economics from Northeastern University in Boston and has a master's degree in economics from Brown University. John's first book Dynamic Economic Decision Making was published by Wiley in August 2011.

 Fill in Driver's License number

- Tag/Plate if you already have a vanity plate then enter your 5 letters and/or digits. If not enter12345
 Under Cardholder Information, enter all information then complete all Payment Information for your credit card
 Hit CONTINUE
- If screen gives you an error message go to the red indicator on screen, fix the error and click CONTINUE again
 You next screen will ask you to review and confirm, click CONFIRM and SUBMIT
 Your next screen is your receipt no need to PRINT as you will get a confirmation by email within minutes

Next you will receive a certificate by snail mail. Put it where you will remember where it is when your tag comes up for renewal (i.e. place in your glove compartment).
