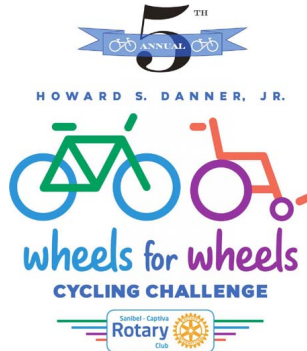

## ***“5<sup>th</sup> Annual Howard S. Danner, Jr. Wheels for Wheels Cycling Challenge”***

***Rotarians Cycling for Wheelchairs***

**October 29, 2022**

The Sanibel Captiva Rotary Club is hosting the 5<sup>th</sup> Annual *“Howard S. Danner, Jr. Wheels for Wheels Cycling Challenge”* for Rotarians to raise money for the Sanibel Captiva Rotary Trust Fund\*. All monies donated will go to the Wheelchair Foundation\*\*. The Wheelchair Foundation is a nonprofit organization leading an international effort to create awareness of the needs and abilities of people with physical disabilities, to promote the joy of giving, create global friendship, and to deliver a wheelchair to every child, teen and adult in the world who needs one, but cannot afford one. For these people, the Sanibel Captiva Rotary Club and Wheelchair Foundation delivers Hope, Mobility and Independence to many.

**For safety, all riders are as asked to wear a helmet, and use a flashing head/taillight.**

The cycling challenge will be open to all Rotarians. Prior to the club event on October 29, 2022, participating Rotarians will obtain \$ per mile donation pledges from Club members, family members, friends, neighbors, etc. to challenge the rider to raise as much money as possible to support the purchase of wheelchairs through the Wheelchair Foundation. Each participating rider will disclose on the pledge form the cycle he or she will use on October 29<sup>th</sup>. (e.g., road bike, mountain bike, tandem cycle, three-wheeler, e-bike, stationary bike). Participating Riders accumulate miles where and when it is convenient for them, whether it is on the road, a trail or a stationary bike. They also may create or join group rides. Each participating cyclist will assure that each pledge donor has a copy of the completed pledge form. Pledge donors will also have the option to directly donate to purchase one or more wheelchairs at \$100 per chair. Checks should be made out to Sanibel Captiva Rotary Trust Fund\*.

Each participating cyclist will keep track of his or her miles ridden on or before October 29<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and will be responsible for collecting the donation from their pledges and offering them a tax receipt, after the event.

All are welcome to attend a celebration beginning at 11:00 AM October 29, 2022, at The Blue Giraffe 2 Restaurant on Par View adjacent to The Sanibel Island Golf Club.

### Call for Road Kill



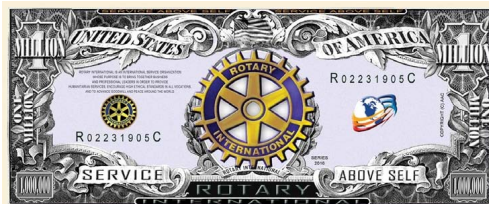

## This week will be hearing from Jill Palmer, Executive Director of the Florida Gulf Coast Chapter of the American Red Cross



Jill Palmer, Executive Director  
Florida Gulf Coast to Heartland Chapter  
Serving Collier, Glades, Hendry, Highlands, and Lee Counties

Jill Palmer leads the American Red Cross Florida Gulf Coast to Heartland Chapter as the Executive Director. The American Red Cross shelters, feeds and provides emotional support to victims of disasters; supplies about 40 percent of the nation's blood; teaches skills that save lives; provides international humanitarian aid; and supports military members and their families.

A former healthcare executive, Jill is a graduate of the University of Central Florida with a Master of Science in Health Science focused on health services administration, gerontology, and legal studies. She is a non-profit professional bringing over 20 years of experience in volunteer management and community service.

Prior to joining the Red Cross senior leadership team in 2017, Jill served as an active board member for the local Red Cross chapter while working for Lee Health as the Director of Volunteer Services, Auxiliary Development and Arts in Healthcare.

As Executive Director, Palmer supports a team of staff and volunteers who proudly serve more than 1.3 million residents in Collier, Glades, Hendry, Highlands and Lee counties. She serves as an ambassador in the community, working closely with community stakeholders, partners and the chapter board to educate and bring awareness and ensure the Red Cross goals and mission are effectively delivered.

Growing up, Jill lived in Guam and the Philippines while her father served in the U.S. Navy and her mom was a nurse volunteering and teaching life-saving Red Cross swim lessons and water safety.

- Under My Bills:
  - Payment Type – Place an R and Rotary will come up, select ROTARY
  - Fill in Driver's License number
  - Tag/Plate if you already have a vanity plate then enter your 5 letters and/or digits. If not enter 12345
- Under Cardholder Information, enter all information then complete all Payment Information for your credit card
- Hit CONTINUE
- If screen gives you an error message go to the red indicator on screen, fix the error and click CONTINUE again
- You next screen will ask you to review and confirm, click CONFIRM and SUBMIT
- Your next screen is your receipt – no need to PRINT as you will get a confirmation by email within minutes

Next you will receive a certificate by snail mail. Put it where you will remember where it is when your tag comes up for renewal (i.e. place in your glove compartment).
