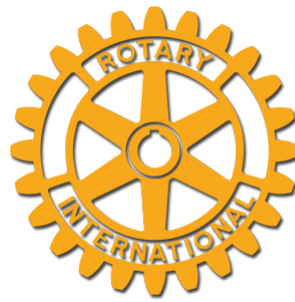

Please help spread the word that those interested in helping our neighbors on Sanibel should meet at **8:30am** at Gator Bites Restaurant parking lot in the Publix plaza closest to the Island (20351 Summerlin Rd, Ste #120, Fort Myers). Volunteers will meet on **Thursdays and Saturdays**. We will then carpool over to the disaster trailer on Sanibel (located at the Bank of the Islands, 1699 Periwinkle Way) to meet at 9:00 for supplies and assignments, and join with those already on Island. Priority jobs we will tackle are moving furniture and trash out of homes, mucking and gutting, and chainsaw work. Volunteers should be ready with boots or appropriate footwear, and work or gardening gloves.

If you aren't as physically able, we may need drivers with passes and people who can be runners for lunches, drinks and tools, that wouldn't be needed the whole day.

Friday's Speaker

This week we will be hearing from John Silvia, updating us on the economy and the factors having an impact on it



John Silvia recently joined our club and recently launched a consulting firm following his retirement as Managing Director and Chief Economist for Wells Fargo which was a position that he held since 2002 prior to Wachovia's acquisition by Wells Fargo. John was named one of the Top 10 forecasters for the last four years by Bloomberg News in 2009 and the No. 2 forecaster by USA Today for 2008.

Prior to Wachovia/Wells Fargo, John worked on Capitol Hill as a senior economist for the U.S. Senate Joint Economic Committee and as a Chief Economist of the Senate Banking, Housing and Urban Affairs Committee. John has also served on economic advisory committees to the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland, the Federal Reserve Bank of Chicago, and the Public Securities Association.

John holds a B.A. and Ph.D. degrees in economics from Northeastern University in Boston and has a master's degree in economics from Brown University. John's first book Dynamic Economic Decision Making was published by Wiley in August 2011.
