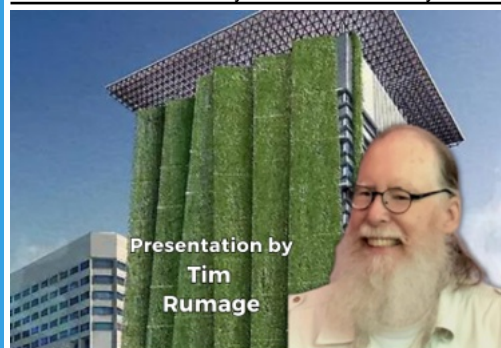

Cheryl and Tom met at a Washington Ethical Society mixer in Washington, DC, which brought clarity to Cheryl. Knowing her tendency to overwork, Cheryl boldly resigned from her job to pursue a relationship with Tom. They eventually chose to settle in Florida and establish their own company, Watson & Walker, Inc., in 1987.

Tom, reflecting on his experience, recalls, "I had been working on mainframes since 1965, although not IBM's. I assumed the roles of editor and novice reader, asking questions that a new IBM mainframe user might have while reading the article." This approach led to a publication that became highly practical within the industry.

The Tuning Letter is not just a superficial publication. Packed with insightful advice, the newsletter revolutionized the mainframe industry and influenced the direction of IBM z/OS systems. When Cheryl highlighted software or hardware issues in an edition, IBM took notice. "My role is to speak truth to power and represent the customer's voice," she states confidently.

Cheryl remains positive about the future of mainframes and has high expectations, particularly regarding AI. "I have high hopes for the mainframe," she muses. "Their importance will grow due to AI."

"Since 1986, Tom has been my anchor. He has shaped my identity in the mainframe realm."



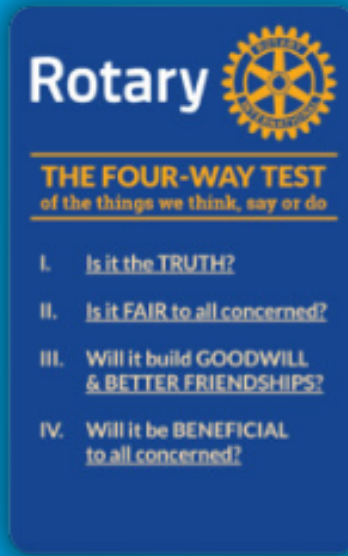

NexTrex Recycling Challenge

THE CLUB HAS ACCEPTED THE CHALLENGE - START SAVING YOUR PLASTIC BAGS!

How does the challenge work?

- Register on **NexTrex.com** to obtain access to the Trex Portal
- Determine a 12-month collection time period
- Collect a minimum of 1,000 lbs.
- Report recycling totals at **my.trex.com**

- Weigh, record and attached pictures
- Deliver the collected plastic film to a participating retailer see list for recycling

Stores prefer smaller and more frequent amounts in the provided bin. Please contact store ahead of time with larger amounts.

What does Trex provide?

- Up to three recycling bins
- Posters

All plastic must be clean, dry and free of food residue.
