The Community Specialty Clinic (CSC) in Sarasota County provides specialty medical care and referral services to uninsured or underinsured residents who demonstrate financial need and are 18 years or older. The clinic has recently expanded with a \$275,000 grant to serve more patients. CSC offers various specialty services, including cardiology, dermatology, endocrinology, gastroenterology, gynecology, neurology, orthopedics, podiatry, limited surgery, and urology, but does not provide primary medical care.

Welcome back Scott Osborne to tell us about the plans and special events to mark the 25th Anniversary of the Through Women's Eyes International Film Festival in beautiful Sarasota, Florida! The 25th Anniversary festival, Reel Equals, is March 7-12, 2024. They are an international, mission-driven festival, dedicated to women filmmakers and films that address issues inadequately represented in the mainstream media. Every year they host significant numbers of films from all over the world.

They frequently select films that go on to commercial success (RBG), publicize the work of voices that need to be heard (Nobel Prize Winner Nadia Murad), and remind the world about issues that need more attention (violence as an act of war in the DRC featuring Nobel Prize Winner Dennis Mukwege).

In 2021, the festival successfully launched on a virtual platform, permitting the most successful festival ever, with viewers from 38 U.S. states and 13 countries. In 2024, the films will be shown both in person at theaters in Sarasota and on our virtual, on-demand platform for a global audience.

Supported by a generous donation from the [Rotary Club of Sarasota Bay](#), the [Rotary Club of Phnom Penh](#) today presented Khmai-language books and bicycles to students at Choun Laong primary school in Kampong Thom Province. Located about a 4-hour drive north of Phnom Penh, Choun Laong is a rural school that has suffered from a lack of resources in recent years. It has 500 students crammed into five classrooms (plus a makeshift open air classroom) who are divided into morning and afternoon sessions. 30 percent of the students are from the indigenous Kuy ethnic community. The books will provide much need Khmai-language reading materials for the kids, and the bikes enable students who live more than 5 kilometers from school to have a reliable way of getting to school (and not dropping out).
