The microforest will include more than 50 native species of trees, shrubs and ground covers. Phase 1 of safe water project for Villa Talandracas is complete

We are happy to report that the Villa Talandracas Phase 1 Safe Water project in Peru has been completed and the Rotary Foundation Global Grant 2014857 has been closed.

Approximately 4,675 people live in the community of Villa Talandracas, Peru. Located in the hot and dry climate of northwestern Peru, most families work in the agricultural trade while earning around \$5 per day.

Rotary Club of Lakewood Ranch Rotarians, **Annie Ross** and **John Freeman**, along with our Peru Host Rotary Club of Castilla partners, visited the community in late 2018 with the hopes and dreams of bringing clean water for all residents.

Villa Talandracas was like many communities in Peru – they lacked access to safe water. Water was pumped from a borehole for several hours a day with an extremely high electrical operating costs. While there was an existing, albeit aging, water tower and piped network that delivered water to every household, the water was untreated and caused unfortunate water-related diseases. Children were the most at risk and could not attend school while dealing with various illnesses.

The Villa Talandracas Phase 1 Safe Water project serving 1,075 residents has been completed with your help and other Rotary Club partners. This community now has a solar- powered water system with 160 solar panels, a new solar- powered pump and a solar inverter electrical system. Thanks to this new system, Villa Talandracas Phase 1 now meets all their water production needs purely on solar power. Families are now drinking safe water that has been chlorinated before it reaches each home. Each of the 215 households now have newly installed water meters that help each household pay

only for their amount of water usage and the community's water is properly conserved.

We are happy to report that the project commissioning ceremony just took place on Nov. 29, 2020, and the community is daily producing and consuming safe water. The Safe Water Committee is fully trained supporting their community. The Villa Talandracas Phase 1 project has completed the one-year follow-up and support phase by our long-standing NGO partner, Water Mission. Throughout the year, the Rotary Club of Castilla and Water Mission Peru team made regularly scheduled visits to support the community with any technical, managerial, or financial challenges as they moved toward a full project transition.

Thanks to your support, 1,075 residents now have access to a sustainable, safe water system. Your humanitarian investment has helped the families of this community lead healthier, more productive lives for generations to come.

Phase 2 of this project has been approved and will serve 3,600 additional residents. We are currently in the implementing phases and appreciate your support.

With your help, we look forward to assisting many more communities with their clean water journey!

MORE PROJECTS FOR OUR NEXT MISSION

We just started a new project at Swan Lake Village on July 17 with more than 3,000 pounds of trash removed from Unit B-7. This two-bedroom unit was given to us by the Swan Lake Management to renovate for a needy veteran. Rotarian **Terry Byce** participated in this endeavor.

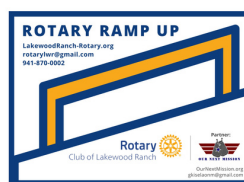
We painted Unit B-7's ceilings and bedroom walls last week. We ordered the metal for the carport and to repair to the roof. The material is expected to be delivered around Labor Day. We decided to complete repairs to the inside while we wait for the metal to be delivered. Most of this work consists of painting, a little paneling replacement and installation of the vinyl flooring along with replacing the lower portion of the kitchen cabinets. All interior components are within our capabilities and can be performed in air-conditioned space to offset the summer heat! See the photos of this unit on this page. The exterior looks great.

We have an 80-year-old disabled veteran candidate who lives in a mobile home that needs extensive repairs that cannot be accomplished with anyone living there. If he qualifies, Unit B-7, would be perfect for his needs. Veterans like him are why we do what we do!

To volunteer to help over the next couple of months, access Unit B7 in Swan Lake Village, 620 57th Ave. W., Bradenton, by going to the front office parking lot, then walk about a half-block to the first street on your left. Normal working hours are 7:30 to 11:30 a.m. Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. Please contact Greg Kisella or Terry Byce to be added to the volunteer list.
