MORE PROJECTS FOR OUR NEXT MISSION

We started a new project at Swan Lake Village on July 17 with more than 3,000 pounds of trash removed from Unit B-7. This two-bedroom unit was given to us by the Swan Lake Management to renovate for a needy veteran. Rotarians **Terry Byce** and **Russ Sexton** are participating in this endeavor.

We are making steady progress on the renovations in B-7. The bedrooms and master bath have been painted and the floors replaced with snap-in-place vinyl. The damaged paneling in the living room and kitchen has been removed. We also are replacing the paneling and painting the ceiling and walls in the kitchen and dining room in anticipation of installing new vinyl flooring. The subfloor in the kitchen has been repaired and we will soon install new kitchen cabinet bases and countertops. It is starting to look like a home. Remember the work on this project is primarily indoors (air-conditioned) to off-set the summer heat.

We are also picking up a new Rotary Ramp the week of Sept. 18 and plan to install it the following week for a veteran's spouse, Debra, in Swan Lake Village. If you would like to participate in this installation, let me know. It normally takes three to four hours for installation. No experience needed! As we get closer, I will let everyone know the exact date for the install.

We have an 80-year-old disabled veteran candidate who lives in a mobile home that needs extensive repairs that cannot be accomplished with anyone living there. If he qualifies, Unit B-7, would be perfect for his needs. Veterans like him are why we do what we do!

To volunteer to help over the next couple of months, access Unit B-7 in Swan Lake Village, 620 57th Ave. W., Bradenton, by going to the front office parking lot, then walk about a half-block to the first street on your left. Normal working hours are 7:30 to 11:30 a.m. Monday, Tuesday and Thursday. Please contact Greg Kisella or Terry Byce to be added to the volunteer list.
