# October 10th Program:



Michael H. Darragh retired from CSX Transportation after 32 years in the railroad industry. He joined CSX as an Operations Supervisor, then progressed through a variety of positions in Operations, Finance, and Asset Management. He spent the last 15 years of his work life in Sales & Marketing, heading teams in a variety of markets from wines and beers, to rocks and cement, using out-of-the-box thinking to significantly grow each market. Mike has also served as a consultant in the transportation industry, as well as an expert witness. The Darraghs have a long tradition of Rotary involvement. His grandfather joined the Rotary Club of St. Louis

in the 1920's, and his father joined the same club in the 1950's. Mike joined the Rotary Club of Fernandina Beach in 1985, then moved to Michigan where he joined the Rotary Club of Plymouth three years later. He has been a member of the Rotary Club of South Jacksonville since retuning to Florida in 1992. Mike has served in a variety of roles for his Rotary Club and became President of South Jacksonville in 1999. Since 2000 Mike served as Club Membership Chair for several years and has served the District as Assistant Governor starting in 2012, District Trainer (2013), Membership Co-Chair (2015), and Discussion Leader for Rotary Leadership Institute (2016). In 2015, he was instrumental in establishing a satellite club for 30-45-year old leaders, the Rotary Satellite Club of South Jacksonville. He is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate from Grinnell College, and completed his MBA at Stanford University School of Business. Mike's work in the membership field, includes research, surveys, and focus groups, and has helped numerous clubs improve the value offered to members. Nancy and Mike have hosted five Rotary Youth Exchanges, and their son was a RYE student in Turkey. They are Bequest Society members, Paul Harris Society members, and Major Donors.

Jacksonville office (which actually oversees all of Northern Florida, clear out to the Panhandle). Rachel noted that while she has the largest FBI territory in Florida, she has the smallest field office (go figure), with Miami and Tampa offices having more staff. Rachel gave a shout out to the FBI's professional staff, who support the agents in the field with critical research and investigation skills. In addition to terrorism, some of the key priorities for the FBI is cybersecurity and foreign espionage. "Things have changed



dramatically since 9/11," she noted. "It's no longer spies chasing other spies." Now, she said, it's FBI agents tracing ownership of seemingly innocuous cellphone apps to foreign powers like China, which are capturing our data. Rachel encouraged everyone to monitor their credit reports: Because you can get one free report from each of the three agencies per year, she noted, you can stagger them, doing a check every four months rather than waiting a whole

year to find out your identity has been compromised. Rachel also encouraged veterans and young people to explore opportunities with the FBI. *Thank you to Jennifer Logue for scribing for me last week!*
