

District 6970 consists of more than 60 Rotary Clubs (as of July 1, 2019) with approximately 3,300 Rotarians. There are eight Rotary Districts in Florida. Mike also shared with us how the relief efforts are going in the Bahamas. District 6970 donations in support of Hurricane Dorian Relief in the Bahamas now totals \$58,610 as of October 12th, 2019. We are also working with several other Rotarian affiliates, such as Disaster-Aid International and ShelterBox. We have started to identify businesses who have the supplies and/or transportation expertise to help us deliver critical

materials where they are needed. Throughout the process, we are being guided by local Bahamian Rotarians and


government officials so that our efforts are targeted to the current needs.
