The Rotary District 6970 Alumni Association, led by our very own Bill Hill, Jon Blauvelt, Magda Cichon, and Tatty Chavez, is launching the second round of its Rotary Feeding Heroes service project. You may remember that the group raised money in the fall to buy meals from local businesses and donate those meals to healthcare workers at UF Health Shands Hospital in Jacksonville. This time around, the alumni association is raising funds to provide meals to personnel at AdventHealth Palm Coast and Halifax Health in Daytona Beach. The project will provide lunch or dinner to approximately 600 healthcare workers at these hospitals in Flagler and Volusia Counties. Project supporters can donate in \$10 increments to buy lunch(s) or dinner(s) for local healthcare heroes. The goal is to raise \$6,000 by the end of March when the group plans to donate the meals.
