## October 27th Program



Marshall M. Butler, the 2016-17 District Governor for Rotary 6970, began his Rotary experience as President of the Robert E. Lee High School Interact Club. Marshall became a part of the family of Rotary for the second time on May 29, 2002, when he joined the Rotary Club of West Jacksonville. During Marshall's term as Governor, Rotary 6970 hosted its first Million Dollar Dinner, had the highest membership net gain in North America, and orchestrated the successful "100 Acts of Good" public image campaign.

Marshall participated in the 107-mile Ride to End Polio in Tucson, AZ, which led to Rotary 6970 making the largest District Designated Fund contribution to the End Polio Campaign in the world that year. Rotary 6970 capped the year with over 500 Rotarians traveling from Florida to Atlanta to attend the district conference,

dubbed the All-Star Conference, featuring RI President John Germ, RI Vice President Jennifer Jones, Rotary General Secretary John Hewko, the first female President of a Rotary club Sylvia Whitlock, plus many others. The All-Star Conference was immediately followed by a week of fellowship at the Rotary International Convention. ROTARY PUBLIC IMAGE COORDINATOR Marshall is a recipient of the Citation for Meritorious Service from Rotary International. He is also a recipient of the Brent Williams "Spirit of Rotary" Award presented by Rotary District 6970. Marshall served three years as an Assistant Rotary Public Image Coordinator and began his term as Rotary Public Image Coordinator for Rotary Zone 34 on July 1, 2020.

A graduate of the University of Florida with a degree in advertising, Marshall has used technology and marketing to help businesses grow over his 30-year career. He consistently looks for new and different ways to inject innovation into every role he has held. Marshall and his wife Karen are Major Donors, members of the Paul Harris Society, PolioPlus Society and Bequest Society. They live in Jacksonville, FL and have two daughters, Emily and Maggie.
