Presentation: Community-Engaged Engineering: Lessons from the Flint Water Crisis

Elliot P. Douglas, Ph.D., is a Fellow member of the American Society for Engineering Education (ASEE), Department Head and Professor in the Department of Environmental Engineering Sciences, and Professor in the Department of Engineering Education at the University of Florida. His research focuses on engineering problem solving and engineering ethics education. He has also published and conducted workshops on qualitative research methods. He is currently on the American Society for Engineering Education Board of Directors and was elected as the American Society for Engineering Education (ASEE) Vice President for Finance for a two-year term starting in June 2025. He has also served as Associate Editor of the Journal of Engineering Education and program officer for engineering education at the U.S. National Science Foundation.

# University of Florida, IFAS-SWES COMPOST COOPERATIVE AND GARDENS The Compost Cooperative and Gardens (CCG) is an outreach program dedicated to promoting sustainability at the campus and community level. Organized by Dr. Ann Wilkie, the CCG was started to educate about the importance of food waste composting and provide participants with the opportunity to compost. The CCG hosts workshops to teach both the UF and Gainesville community how to compost their food waste and to appreciate the value of recycling by turning this waste into natural The CCG operates composters to help the UF community recycle food waste, and closes the nutrient loop by using the resulting compost to grow organic food in a student-run garden. By promoting eco-friendly practices, the CCG fosters environmental awareness and responsibility while offering participants a space to relax, study, and enjoy nature. The cooperative also hosts gardening days to share the benefits of composting. The CCG hosts student orientations every Friday at 5:00pm. The orientation for the CCG will provide you with an in depth introduction to the cooperative, ensuring that you have the knowledge necessary to compost effectively and understand your role in creating a greener planet! ## **South Sudan**

Jacob Atem, a fellow Rotarian who is from South Sudan, had sent area Rotary clubs this request for help with a devastating outbreak of cholera: My name is Dr. Jacob Atem, and I am a member of the Rotary Club of Gainesville. I recently returned from South Sudan, where a devastating Cholera outbreak has been ongoing since last year, claiming the lives of children, women, and the elderly. I have shared this heartbreaking situation with our District 6970, hoping that Rotarians in our district can come together to support the people of South Sudan during this crisis. One of the Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) camps managed by the Southern Sudan Healthcare Organization (SSHCO) serves a population of over 59,000 people in need of medical care.

In response, our club sent \$1000 to help.

# **End Polio Now**

On 12 April 1955, history was made when Dr. Jonas Salk announced the successful testing of his experimental polio vaccine. That same day, the vaccine would be licensed, and we know it today as the inactivated polio vaccine (IPV).

In 1955, more than 10 million children received one or more injections of the Salk vaccine. Within one year, polio cases and deaths in the US had been nearly halved, a trend that continued and made a vision of polio-free world a possibility.
