

Dr.Norman L. Beatty is an Assistant Professor of Medicine at the University of Florida College of Medicine, Department of Medicine, Division of Infectious Diseases and Global Medicine. He graduated from the University of Central Florida College of Medicine with a B.S. in Molecular Biology and Microbiology, and a B.S. in Biotechnology. He then went on to study at Ross University School of Medicine and graduated with High Honors with his M.D. degree. He completed his Internal Medicine residency and Fellowship in Infectious Diseases at the University of Arizona College of Medicine - Tucson.

Dr. Beatty has been studying triatomines (kissing bugs) the insect vector responsible for transmitting the parasite that causes Chagas disease in humans and other mammals and Chagas disease since 2015. He is currently researching the prevalence of Chagas disease in Florida as well as throughout the United States. His research has been presented at several conferences, including both the Infectious Diseases Society of America and the American Society of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene annual scientific meetings.

RCDG is providing a gift of clothing and a toy or game to 20 children who participate in the MEP program. We will meet at the First United Methodist Church (419NE 1st Street) on Wednesday, December 4, from 12 until 2pm to wrap the gifts and to enjoy the spirit of the Holiday season. Local Rotary Clubs Provide Grants to Three Community Projects

The Rotary Clubs of Gainesville Foundation will sponsor the expansion of the Emergency Food Pantry for the Gainesville Catholic Charities office, replace the existing playground with an exciting new structure for the Girls Place, Inc. and support the installation of a 50-foot flagpole and large United States of America flag at the Veterans Memorial Park in conjunction with the Alachua County Veteran's Memorial Committee.

Gainesville, FL, October 23, 2024: The Rotary Clubs of Gainesville Foundation Inc., at its October 17, 2024 Board of Directors meeting, reviewed 25 community grant applications requesting funds from the 2025 Rotary Wild Game Feast. The Board is proud to announce that the recipients of the 2025 Rotary Wild Game Feast grant will be three worthy local organizations: Catholic Charities Bureau Inc. – Gainesville Regional Office, Girls Place, Inc., and Alachua County Veteran's Memorial Committee. The 2025 Rotary Wild Game Feast will be held March 6, 2025.

"2025 marks our 40th year of this event and we are excited to be able to make a difference in three unique community areas of need through the 2025 Rotary Wild Game Feast. We are committing more than \$100,000 to these projects, continuing our legacy of supporting our local non-profit organizations to do good in the community. Selecting the recipients from 25 worthy grant applications was not an easy task, however our board felt Catholic Charities, Girls Place, and the Alachua County Veteran's Memorial Committee were organizations who impact our community in three distinct ways, and we liked the diversity of the projects." – Matthew Braddy, Feast Master 2025.

The Gainesville Regional Office of Catholic Charities maintains an Emergency Food Pantry, providing essential shelf-stable food to those facing food insecurities. Generous donations of food often necessitate refrigeration or freezer storage. Denise Fanning, Regional Director of Catholic Charities is thrilled to be part of the 2025 Rotary Wild Game Feast recipients and says, "the expansion of our infrastructure enhances the pantry's ability to assist a larger segment of the community in need, we can continue to be a reliable resource for individuals and families during times of hardship".

Benefiting over 350 girls a year, Girls Place is looking to renovate their playground to serve many more girls in the future with structures to encourage free play in the outdoors. Executive Director, Christi Arrington, said upon the news of the 2025 Rotary Wild Game Feast grant "without this generosity, our girls would have to wait to have a new playground, now we will have one in time for summer in 2025, thank you Rotary". Girls Place offers year-round programming for girls ages 5-14 in our community, empowering them to grow courageous, strong, and self-sufficient. This new play area will certainly support those goals.

Local Rotary Clubs Provide Grants to Three Community Projects

The third project to be funded by the 2025 Rotary Wild Game Feast will be the installation of a 50-foot flagpole, with an appropriate large United States of America flag. Lieutenant Colonel Jason Robinson, current chair of the Alachua County Veteran's Memorial Committee, said of this project, "replacing the existing small flagpole will mean the flag will be visible from all parts of the Veteran's Memorial Park and bring joy to the hearts of veterans and their families when they visit the site". The Alachua County Veteran's Memorial Committee is committed to providing a Veteran's Memorial in honor of Alachua County Citizens who have died in service to the United States of America.
