Living' the Dream


I was born and raised here in Alachua County, attending Terwilliger, Lawton Chiles, Kanapaha and graduated from Buchholz in 2007.



RLI offers Rotary knowledge courses in three sessions (Parts I, II, and III.). The courses are designed to provide leadership skills while advancing Rotary knowledge and understanding. Part 1 is *The Rotarian*, Part II is The *Rotary Club* and Part III is *The Rotary Journey*. Those completing each course are eligible for the next. There are Graduate courses available to those who have completed the three-part RLI curriculum. The Graduate courses focus on one Rotary topic for the session .
