

Biography


Michael Chriszt is vice president and regional engagement officer in the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta's Corporate Engagement Division. In this role, he serves as the Atlanta Fed's lead public engagement officer focusing on smaller cities and towns, as well as rural areas, in the Skth District, connecting directly with citizens to explain the Federal Reserve and its policy decisions, and he in turn learns how the economy is affecting their lives. He shares this information with the Bank's senior leaders and other policy experts throughout the Atlanta Fed to deepen understanding of the District economy.


Prior to assuming his current responsibilities, Chriszt was a vice president and public affairs officer, where he led the Bank's outreach and communications efforts. Before joining Public Affairs, he worked in the Atlanta Fed's Research Department, where he held numerous positions, including leadership positions in the Bank's Regional Economic Information Network.

While at Miami University in Ohio, Chriszt earned two bachelor's degrees, one in history and one in diplomacy and foreign affairs. He also earned a master's degree there in political science with emphases on international economics and comparative politics.

Chriszt is a member of the National Association of Business Economists and the Atlanta Economics Club, where he served as president from 2015 to 2017. He also serves on the advisory board of the Michael J. Coles College of Business at Kennesaw State University and the board of the Georgia Council on Economic Education. A native of Cleveland, Ohio, Chriszt is married to Maxine, and they have five children and three grandchildren.

There are four main youth oriented programs.

Interact Clubs

Interact clubs bring together young people ages 12-18 to develop leadership skills and learn about the world through service projects and activities. Clubs are in the middle and high school settings.

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA)-

RYLA is a leadership development program for young people who want to learn new skills, build their confidence, and have fun. Events range from one-day seminars to week-long camps. This opportunity is offered to rising juniors and seniors in high school.

Rotary Youth Exchange (RYE)

Rotary Youth Exchange builds peace one young person at a time. Students learn a new language, discover another culture, and truly become global citizens. Exchanges for students ages 15-19 are sponsored by Rotary clubs in more than 100 countries.

New Generations Service Exchange

New Generations Service Exchange is a short-term, customizable program for university students and professionals up to age 30. Participants design exchanges that combine their professional goals with a humanitarian project.

We are fortunate to have great youth programs and many dedicated volunteers in our District. A substantial number of new and renewed Interact clubs have been established this year. The District Youth Exchange Program was successfully restarted after the COVID hiatus. And we are looking forward to an outstanding RYLA event at Stetson University in June


Yep, it's getting to be that time of year! Our dub's annual auction! An evening of fun, food, fellowship to raise funds for the Rotary Foundation
