Gainesville Opportunity Center holds second annual Bike Day



Bikers hit the trails here at depot park on Saturday, May 13th, to help raise awareness for mental health services at the Gainesville Opportunity Center's second-annual bike day.

Bicyclists could choose from two rides--a six-mile loop or a 24-mile loop around the Hawthorne Trail.

The event is put on by the Gainesville Opportunity Center--which helps people dealing with mental illness get back to work.

"This bike day event--which is a public event--is just to raise awareness," said the GOC's development director, Brett Buell. "People don't know we're here, they don't know that we're helping people, they don't know how we're helping people and this event will help people understand what we're doing. "The members--not patients, not clients--come to our center, help us run our business and they prove to themselves that they can be productive again," continued Buell. "From there, we give them support, we help them get out into the community, we help them find jobs and then we work with the employers so that they can keep those jobs."

Restructuring of Dues: Effective April 1, 2023

Please note the following restructuring of dues:

- Does not apply to members who are currently billed for dues without meals included (rule of 85)
- It does not affect the amount that members have pledged for PHF sustaining pledges or trivia contributions. Those charges will still be included on your invoice.
- CURRENT MEMBERS: dues reduced from the current \$287 per quarter to \$225
- NEW MEMBERS: dues reduced for new members to \$200 per quarter for 1st year and waive the \$50 new member fee
- NON PROFITS: Dues reduced to \$200 per quarter and waive the \$50 new member fee for future members employed by non-profits
- The above changes are effective 04/01/2023. If members want to "opt out" of the dues decrease and maintain their current billing amount, they should have that option or apply the difference to Paul Harris.
