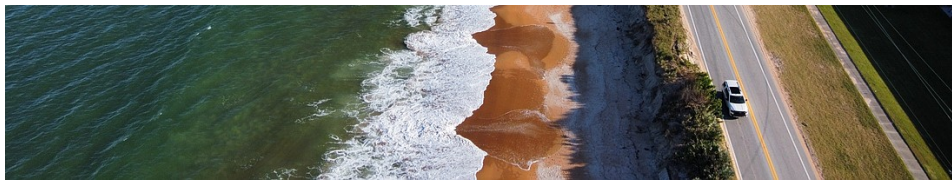

Volusia County Plans Meetings to Discuss Dune Recovery Project

Volusia County is preparing to launch its dune recovery project and needs easements from beachfront property owners.





The county plans to host multiple meetings soon on the project to answer questions and give people an opportunity to sign an easement.

The project is intended to restore dunes that took a hit in hurricanes Ian and Nicole and is expected to begin late this year, according to a county news release.

The project, funded by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, will place sand along parts of the beach without charge to property owners. However, the property owners must have an easement on record with the county to allow for that to happen.

People who have already given the county an easement through the TrapBag program, which took place in 2023, don't need to submit a new one to participate in the dune recovery project. People who provided an easement but want to opt out of the project need to contact the county.

The TrapBags have to be removed by March 31, but property owners can keep the sand that's in them at the site

Property owners who have not submitted an easement and want to participate in the dune recovery project need to contact the county to start the process.

To explain the project and answer questions, county officials will host open-house-style meetings where people can come and go between 4:30 and 6:30 p.m. The meetings are planned for:

- July 17 at the Daytona Beach Shores Community Center at 3000 Bellemead Drive.
- July 30 at the Ponce Inlet Community Center at 4670 S. Peninsula Drive.
- July 31 at the Brannon Center at 105 S Riverside Drive in New Smyrna Beach.

"While attending these meetings is optional and not required for sand placement participation, signing an easement agreement is necessary," according to the county. "To facilitate this process, complimentary notary services will be provided at the meetings and several county offices."

Together, WE CAN END POLIO! Be a part of history, won't you?

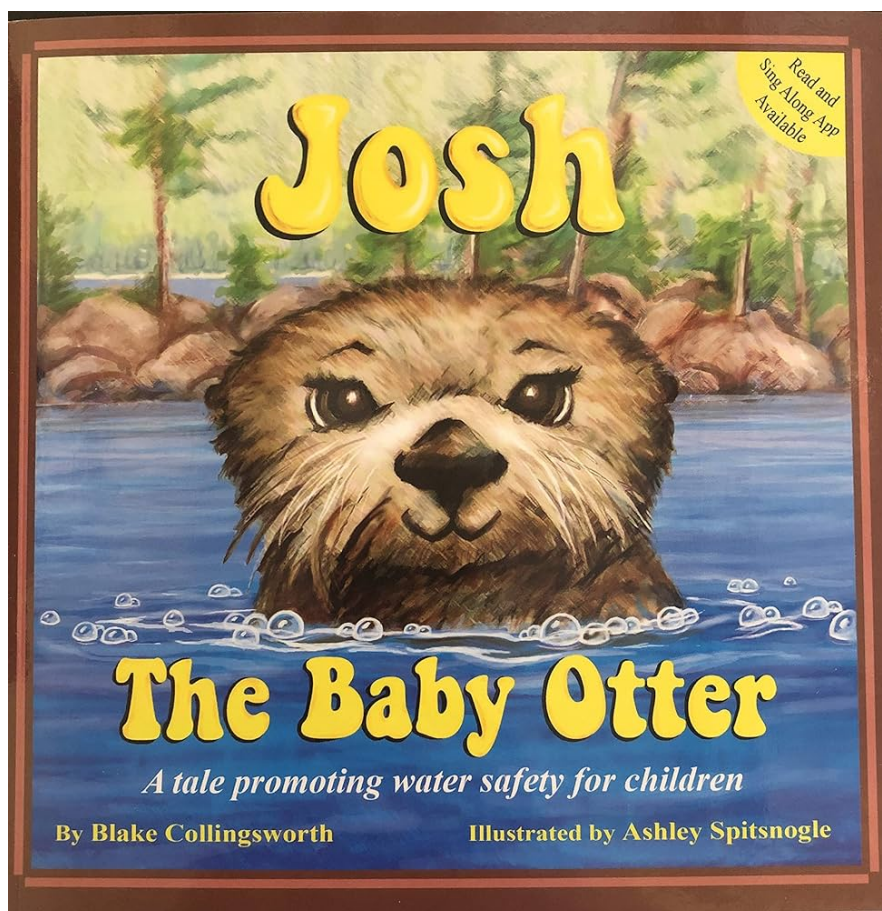

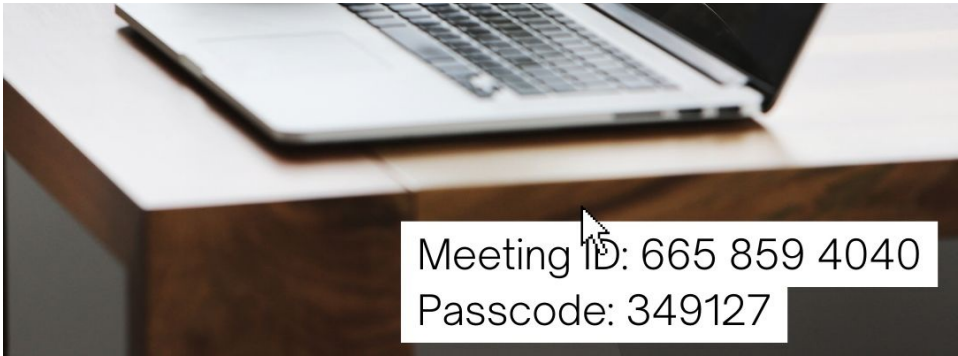
