George Recktenwald, a 22-year veteran of local government management, was appointed Volusia County Manager earlier this month. Mr. Recktenwald began his career with Volusia County in 1997 as a public works supervisor and worked his way up to construction manager, road and bridge director, public works director, and public protection director. In February 2016, he was named deputy county manager with direct responsibility for the departments of Public Works, Public Protection, Growth and Resource Management, and Aviation and Economic Resources. During his tenure with Volusia County, he has had extensive interaction with elected officials and the public and has worked with other local governments on large-scale planning and infrastructure projects such as regional water treatment and stormwater, transportation projects, and city

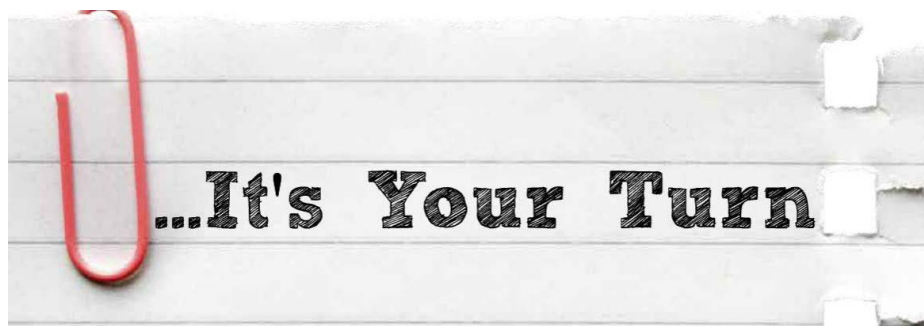

His accomplishments include: ♦ Completing an award-winning Public Works department-wide efficiency study and plan, which resulted in \$32 million in documented savings over the past 10 years. ♦ Overseeing the construction and opening of the \$81 million Ocean Center expansion. ♦ Reorganizing and introducing an updated Beach Safety and Ocean Rescue Division with a greater emphasis on beach and water safety. ♦ Implemented asset management and scheduling systems in the largest departments to better monitor and control personnel costs. ♦ Assuming responsibility for county operations in multiple FEMA events since 1997, including the 1997 wildfires, various floods, the three hurricanes of 2004 and more recently Hurricanes Matthew and Irma. Before joining the Volusia County team, he worked as a physics instructor and department chairperson at New Smyrna Beach High School (1995-1997), project manager repairing bridges and elevated water towers, etc. for Sieg & Sons (1989-1995), and engineering technician/inspector for the Florida Department of Transportation (1986-1989). Recktenwald has a bachelor's degree in Industrial Technology from the State University of New York at Binghamton. In 1998, he was awarded Florida Association of Counties (FACERS) Engineer of the Year. In 2011, he became one of the original 100 American Public Works Association Fellows. In 2012, the Florida Chapter of the American Public Works Association named him Public Works Director of the Year.

Did You Know?



- Rotary established the **Endowment Fund** in 1917, which became the forerunner of The Rotary Foundation.
 - Rotary first adopted the name **Rotary International** in 1922 when the name was changed from the International Association of Rotary Clubs.
 - Rotary first established the Paul Harris Fellows recognition in 1957 for contributors of US \$1,000 to The Rotary Foundation.
 - The Rotary emblem was printed on a commemorative stamp for the first time in 1931 at the time of the Vienna Convention.
 - The first Rotary club banner (from the Houston Space Center) to orbit the moon was carried by astronaut Frank Borman, a member of that club.
 - The first Rotary International convention held outside the United States was in Edinburgh, Scotland, in 1921.
 - The first head of state to address a Rotary convention was U.S. President Warren G. Harding in 1923 at St. Louis.
 - The Rotary Foundation gave its first gift in 1929 of US \$500 to the National Society for Crippled Children, later Easter Seals, founded in 1921 by Rotarian Edgar F. Allen, of the Rotary Club of Elyria, Ohio, USA. Paul Harris served as chair of the organization.
