He graduated the University of Florida with a degree in Business Administration and graduated from Florida State University College of Law, Cum Laude with his Juris Doctorate.

He began working as an intern for the Public Defender's office immediately out of law school while studying for the bar and became a misdemeanor attorney upon passing the bar. He quickly moved up to a felony attorney and eventually became the Felony Division Chief for the Daytona Beach office. In that role he directly supervises 11 other attorneys and their staff while also handling over 100 cases at any given time. He also spends time working on administrative issues and mentoring new attorneys. He is a Board Certified Criminal Trial Attorney and has previously presented a continuing legal education course for the local defense bar.

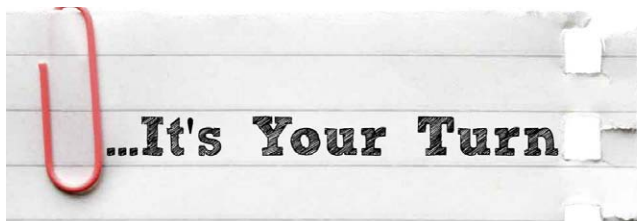

Membership and the Council on Legislation



Members of District 6970, I have just returned from a week as your representative, to the Council on Legislation. Here are just a few notes, that may be of interest to you.

The Council meets every three years. There is one voting member from each of our 538 Districts plus, the Council team, support staff from the Evanston offices, the current board and trustees as well as a number of our Past Presidents of Rotary in attendance. Please note, however, only the 538 District representatives vote on legislation.

We considered over 117 enactments. Many did not pass, of those that did, I offer the following:

Enactment 19-82, to raise our dues \$1.00 per year for three years, starting in 2019-20

Enactment 19-72, to admit Rotaract Clubs to RI membership

Enactment 19-117, to pursue 501c3 status for Rotary International

First question that has been coming up, has been regarding Rotaract. Please understand, this does not make Rotaractors Rotarians, does not provide them with a membership ID, does not require them to pay dues. It does, however, recognize their Rotaract Clubs, as clubs in Rotary International. This was a small step in elevating Rotaract and their approximate 10,000 clubs around our Rotary world.

The book I used, the vote totals and the how I voted on your behalf, will be available for your viewing at the upcoming District Assembly, during the COL breakout where I'll share some more of my observations from this years meeting.
