Rick Hutton and Eric Neihaus will explain GRU's Integrated Resource Plan. Rick is a professional engineer and Eric is a planning engineer, both at GRU.



More than Energy

(conservation, energy efficiency, etc.) and the more traditional supply-side resources (generation/power plants, transmission lines, and more) in making its recommendations on how best to meet future electric energy needs.

Integrated resource planning is important because it allows utilities to proactively identify and evaluate a range of potential resources that can be used to meet customer demand in a more cost-effective way.

GRU is seeking community input to help shape its Integrated Resource Plan (IRP). The IRP is the long-range blueprint for supplying reliable, affordable, and environmentally responsible energy at competitive rates.



Last Week: Using and Reusing Our Water

Last week, Rick Hutton and Kristen Sealey of Gainesville Regional Utilities told us how we use water, then it becomes wastewater, and then we use the water again--but some time later after it is naturally filtered and renters the Floridian Aquifer. They have projects such as Sweetwater Wetlands park and a new water recharge area on the west side of Gainesville to make this happen. They even did a reverse triva question in an attempt to outdo the Triva Master, as a way to let us know that there are about 2,000 miles of piping in GRU's water use and distribution system.

At Len Furlow's memorial service, Dorothy and I met Lyuba and Willam Wharton. They had worked with Len in Kyiv, Ukraine. I shared the recent newsletter with information about Len, and Lyuba shared a few photos and information with me. Here is their response.

?Thank you, Pamela! I sent your club's article about Dr. Furlow to Dr. Natalia Tetruieva in Ukraine. She was grateful for it. She had learned a lot from Dr. Brent Seagle about Dr. Furlow's cleft palate surgery technique. Then, world-famous Dr. Furlow himself came to Kyiv and performed several surgeries together with Natalia. She was immeasurably thankful for his teaching. During the surgeries, he shared every detail of his procedure. From then on, Natalia certainly had a perfect example to follow. We were proud to learn that a year ago Natalia was chosen as one of the best female surgeons in the world. Unfortunately, now Natalia, in addition to treating children born with cleft lip and palate, operates on those wounded in the face during the war. We are supporting Natalia's hospital and many Ukrainian people who were wounded, lost family members and lost homes during this terrible war with Russia. We also ship medical supplies and clothes. 


Rick and Teina Do Jonesboro
