This Week: Sunrisers Tour South America from a Hat

Two Sunrisers, Ron Farb and Greg Schultz, along with their able assistant, Dianne Farb, recently returned from a trip to South America. This week, we'll hear about their unique and very interesting trip. Greg Schultz, sent this brief summary of what we will hear.

"We started in Lima, Peru to prepare for our first adventure in La Paz, Bolivia. In La Paz we viewed Moon Valley, rode cable cars, traveled to Lake Titicaca (the highest navigable lake in the world), the city of Copacabana, and took a catamaran to Sun Island. From there we moved to the Uyuni salt flat and the many colored lakes and saw lots of flamingos. We drove over 400 miles in Bolivia and covered lots of terrain.


We traveled from Bolivia to Chile to visit Atacama. We hiked, biked and swam in the salty lagoon there with 30+% salinity. However, the swim was only for 10 minutes because your skin would dry out like a prune if you swam longer. From Atacama we traveled to Santiago to prepare for our departure to Easter Island to visit the many Moai

We returned to Santiago and our last travels included a visit to the city of Valparaiso and a winery tour at Casa del






Great to See Two Longtime Members


