Plans for the Florida Museum of Natural History

Last week Jaret Daniels gave us a great overview of the plans for the renovation of the museum. It will be closing on January 6, 2025, for about 12-15 months in order to undergo a complete renovation, particularly of the front portion of the building. In addition to a completely new exterior, the lobby area and other portions of the building will see a transition from the old to the new. Closing will allow a much quicker reopening instead of 20 months to do the job, by trying to remain open during the renovation. The museum is top-ranked among natural history museums nationwide, just behind Harvard and Yale, but actually secures more grants and publishes more papers than either of these

One of the main reasons visitors come to the museum is interaction with scientists. Last year, about 242,000 people came to the museum, making it the top destination in the Gainesville area. The total reach was 1.1 million people when traveling exhibits are included. Currently, the museum has 10 million specimens and this grows by about 250,000 per year with space about maxed out. 
Now Rupa's Fly Fishing in Colorado

Sunrise Two-man Fishing Team in Action

Last Tuesday, in an effort to keep up with Sunrise's new **FEMALE-FISHING-PHENOM**, Rupa Lloyd, Sunrise's **TWO-MAN** fishing team of Michael Turner and Jim Cato made a frantic fishing trip to Crystal River, a few days after H. Helene went through. Along the river, almost every dock is damaged or destroyed. All homes and businesses have their contents on the street for pickup. Water was in every structure and Pete's Pier (shown) from which we left for fishing had 5.5 feet of water in the building. Most channel markers are leaning, missing or the signs gone. Every coastal town on this coast had the same damage from Helene. It was almost eerie going out in the fog and seeming to be isolated since very few boats were on the water. Of course, the charter captains are out of work for the week after Helene and all their out-of-town clients have canceled upcoming trips. We did our part to keep Captain Leon employed and money injected into the Crystal River economy.

We had a good catch. Of course, no bait was available, so we put out a couple of pinfish traps, went fishing for speckled trout for a couple of hours using artificial lures, then collected enough pinfish for bait the next few hours. We caught our limit of redfish and three speckled trout keepers. We caught a number of other trout, just short of the legal size, and had to toss them back. A 31-inch grouper, which Michael fell in love with but put back since the season is closed (note the farewell kiss). The redfish is shown ready for cooking on the grill on Tuesday evening. We fished with Capt. Leon of Reel Time Outfitters. Did we outfish Rupa? You be the judge.
