

Happier times: Clark Hodge and new Sunrise Rotarian Chuck Geiger in May 2018.



The Memorial Service will be held at First Presbyterian this Friday, May 3, at 2:00 p.m.


More than 2300 Dictionaries Were Distributed Last Week

Thanks so much to the Rotarians from across Alachua County who answered the call last week to prepare and distribute dictionaries to more than 2300 3rd graders in our public schools.

The effort was part of the annual Dictionary Project, a national initiative founded in 1995 that has to date distributed more than 35 million dictionaries to children in the US and internationally.

We've included a few photos from the labeling party held at the Ronald McDonald House, and then a couple more from Rotarians who dropped off the books to the classrooms. Rotarians from every one of our clubs participated, and distributed books in three days!

Educators see third grade as the dividing line between learning to read and reading to learn, so everyone should take pride in a program that helps students become good writers, active readers, creative thinkers, and resourceful learners. The dictionaries and labels were purchased with funds from our local Rotary Foundation -- another reason to support the Wild Game Feast!

Don Matz of Orange Insurance Exchange: Navigating Florida's Volatile Insurance Landscape



Thank you to Don Matz, the CEO of the newly formed Orange Insurance Exchange, who spoke to our club last week about factors driving the rising cost of property insurance in Florida, and what his company is doing about it.

The good news, Matz said, is that Florida's good building codes and recent changes by the Florida legislature are helping rates level off, at least in the residential market. In fact, some insurers who left the state are starting to come back, which is good news for beleaguered homeowners paying sky-high premiums.

The not-so-good news is that insurance rates for retail commercial property, which doesn't enjoy state subsidies, are still through the roof (no pun intended). And rates for both commercial and residential properties most like won't ever return to the rates Floridians paid even five years ago.

Thinking back on some of the sobering news that Mr. Matz shared, let's hope we see more industry experts like him who lead businesses that can respond to Florida's volatile insurance landscape, providing viable solutions for homeowners and businesses alike.


Someone is Working Hard to Help the Hilton Up Its Game
