May 21st, Tim Rogers, Jacksonville Public Library

Tim Rogers is the Director of the Jacksonville Public Library System. Mr. Rogers has more than 16 years of experience in various library director positions. As the executive director at the Metropolitan Library System (Oklahoma City), he was responsible for the strategic and operational results of a library serving more than 750,000 people from 19 branch locations with more than 425 full-time employees. At NC LIVE a library consortium for the state of North Carolina he was the executive director and ran the statewide consortium of more than 200 academic and public libraries. Mr. Rogers also held director-level roles at the largest public library in Kansas (Johnson County Library), Coffey County Library also in Kansas and Oneida Public Library in central New York.

Bernie Grossman, Ph.D., Our Technological Future

Bernie Grossman, Ph. D., and teacher in the adult education classes through OLLI at UNF, explained some of the technological changes that we can expect in the not so distant future. He reminded the club that although some of the changes are frightening, historically technology has improved the standard of living. Self Driving cars, robotic warfare, machines that have the ability to learn without being specifically programmed for a task, 3D printed body parts, "meat" grown in the lab, and ultra fast quantum computers are part of our future. The underpinning of all these things is artificial intelligence (AI).

New computers have the ability to use self learning and become masters at a task. This now includes the ability to generate options that humans have never considered. Using artificial intelligence, these machines use facial cues to understand human emotions better than humans are able.

Mr. Grossman believes that future generations will not own cars nor need drivers licenses. By 2025, it is predicted that self-driving cars will be the norm. Rather than purchasing a vehicle, consumers will use a community car to reach their destination. Since 95% of car accidents that include fatalities occur due to human error, it is expected that the self-driving car will greatly reduce the number of fatalities from auto accidents.
