Adult Mental Health First Aid is a 6-hour training course designed to give community members key skills to help someone who is developing or experiencing a mental health crisis. You will earn a three-year certification for attending this course. There is no charge to attend.

The training curriculum was developed by mental health professionals and is designed to provide practical knowledge that can be put to use right away.

Participants will:

- Use a 5-step action plan to recognize symptoms of mental health issues
- Identify common mental health challenges for adults including anxiety, depression, and substance abuse
- Learn effective ways to provide initial help and guidance

This Week in History

The First Supreme Court

The Judiciary Act of 1789 is passed by Congress and signed by President George Washington, establishing the Supreme Court of the United States as a tribunal made up of six justices who were to

serve on the court until death or retirement. That day, President Washington nominated John Jay to preside as chief justice, and John Rutledge, William Cushing, John Blair, Robert Harrison, and James Wilson to be associate justices. On September 26, all six appointments were confirmed by the U.S. Senate.

The U.S. Supreme Court was established by Article 3 of the U.S. Constitution. The Constitution granted the Supreme Court ultimate jurisdiction over all laws, especially those in which their constitutionality was at issue. The high court was also designated to oversee cases concerning treaties of the United States, foreign diplomats, admiralty practice, and maritime jurisdiction. On February 1, 1790, the first session of the U.S. Supreme Court was held in New York City's Royal Exchange Building.
