While the debate was said to be spirited, it resulted in a proposal on the table to:

"Cede that portion of the city and tributary territory lying south of the St. Johns River to a Rotary Club of South Jacksonville. However, the club reserved the right to admit members

Founding of Rotary International

On February 23, 1905, Paul Harris, a lawyer, met with three friends in Chicago to discuss the idea of forming a club for business and professional men. They wanted to create a place where they could network, share ideas, and give back to their community. This meeting marked the beginning of Rotary International.

Early Years

The Rotary Club of Chicago was the first Rotary club. It quickly grew in popularity, and other clubs were soon formed in cities across the United States. In 1910, the National Association of Rotary Clubs was formed to bring together the various clubs.

International Expansion

Rotary soon expanded beyond the borders of the United States. The first international club was founded in Winnipeg, Canada, in 1912. Today, there are Rotary clubs in more than 200 countries and regions around the world.

Rotary Founders Day

Rotary Founders Day is celebrated on February 23 each year to commemorate the founding of Rotary International. It is a day for Rotarians to reflect on the history of their organization and to celebrate the work that they do to make a difference in the world.

How to Celebrate Rotary Founders Day

There are many ways to celebrate Rotary Founders Day. Some clubs hold special events, such as dinners or fundraisers. Others use the day to promote Rotary to the public. However you choose to celebrate, Rotary Founders Day is a time to be proud of the organization's history and its accomplishments.
