We gathered at WJCT-TV Studios to listen to the best of the best compete to become top Orator.

WJXT-TV Anchor Mary Baer and our own 1010XL radio personality Jack O'Brien entertained the audience with their emcee talents while the WJCT-TV production team recorded the event for television broadcast later this year.

Including this year's donations, our club has awarded over \$65,000 for scholarships and student awards over the five years of our project.

You could see the judges, composed of college speech professors and professionals in the public forum arena, struggling to decide the scores and eventually to determine which finalist would receive the \$5,000 scholarship.



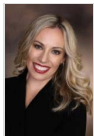
