When you receive this newsletter, Ann and I, along with 40 other D6970 Rotarians will be in Singapore for the 2024 International Convention. Locally, it is 5am on Monday and the Opening Ceremonies took place Sunday, 26 May 2024.

The headline address from the first session was given by Graca Machel, Mozambican politician and humanitarian. The widow of former President of Mozambique Samora Machel and former President of South Africa Nelson Mandela, Machel advocates for women's and children's rights worldwide.

She was a freedom fighter in Mozambique's FRELIMO movement and the country's first Minister of Education. Machel is a member of the United Nations' Secretary-General's High Level Sustainable Development Goals Advocacy Group.

RI President R. Gordon McInally gave the Welcome Address, and we witnessed some great entertainment.

We are all looking forward to an exciting week ahead and in particular, the District dinner social at Jumbo Seafood, Tuesday evening, arranged by DGN Dale Moe.

You can follow the events on Rotary.org and will soon be able to make plans for attending the 2025 Convention in Calgary, Alberta, Canada.

It is my sincere hope that each of you will be able to experience an International Convention at some point. It will be unforgettable.
