This Week's Topic: Al Kalter, Osher Lifelong Learning institute



Al Kalter has been a Rotarian for over 40 years, originally in Syracuse, New York, and since 2000 here in Florida. A member of the Bartram Trail Rotary Club, Al is known as the “Father of Rotary Youth Exchange” in District 6970, having created the very successful Youth Exchange program here and then spreading it throughout the state. Over the past two decades, well over a thousand Florida teenagers have enjoyed the experience of a lifetime spending a year overseas as Rotary exchange students, and an equal number of young ambassadors from around the world have come here to discover our communities, our state, and our country. It is Al’s greatest honor

to have shared the world with the Sunshine State, to have friends and extended family members all over the globe, and to be able to help promote Rotary’s goals of international understanding and peace.

Professionally, Al is a “semi-retired” software designer, with more than four decades of experience designing applications for large and small businesses and organizations. With the free time that “semi-retirement” offers, Al is trying to improve his golf game – not very successfully – and is also hosting a bi-weekly radio program at UNF focusing on the music of “our generation”.

At a Rotary meeting last fall, his club heard from a representative of OLLI, and shortly thereafter, Al and other club members signed up to take courses through the program at UNF. So today he will be telling us about OLLI, in the hope that other Rotarians will be able to enjoy the educational, cultural, and social opportunities that OLLI offers.
