Lael Stieglitz, MD, MPH, is a member of the American Urological Association known for her approach to treating the whole patient and not just the disease. Dr. Stieglitz has extensive research experience, having been published in numerous urologic journals and textbooks. She is well trained in management of both benign and malignant conditions of prostate, bladder and kidney. Dr. Stieglitz has expertise in open, laparoscopic and robotic procedures.

Dr. Stieglitz graduated from JU in 2006 with a Bachelor of Science degree. She went on to receive her medical degree from the Medical College of Georgia in Augusta; next to do her graduate work, finishing with a Master of Public Health, at Emory University in Atlanta; then, completed her Residency at Dartmouth Medical School in Lebanon, NH.




