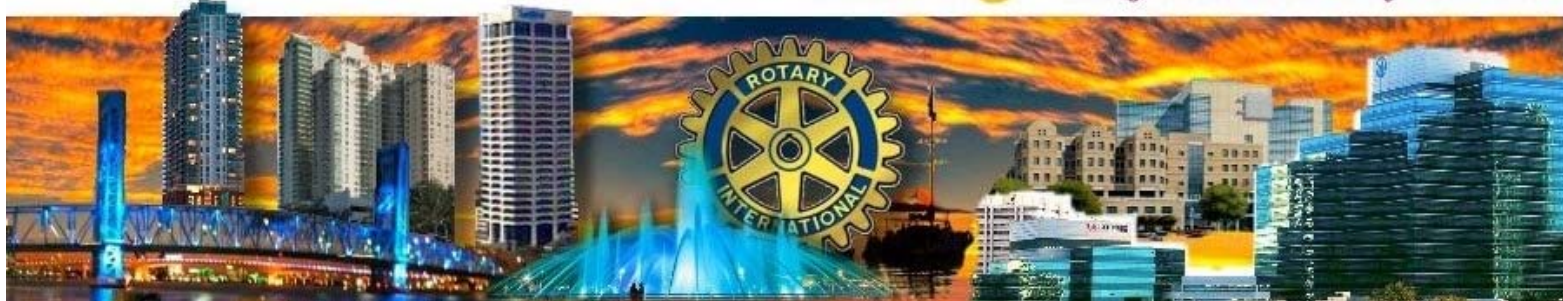

**Timothy J. Corrigan** (born February 21, 1956) is the Chief United States District Judge of the United States District Court for the Middle District of Florida.

On November 2, 2020, United States District Judge Timothy J. Corrigan assumed the duties of Chief Judge of the United States District Court for the Middle District of Florida. Judge Corrigan, who is stationed in Jacksonville, succeeds Judge Steven D. Merryday of the Tampa Division, who served as Chief Judge from August 1, 2015 to November 1, 2020.

President George W. Bush appointed Judge Corrigan...

President George W. Bush appointed Judge Corrigan to the federal bench in 2002. Before that appointment, Judge Corrigan served for six years as a United States Magistrate Judge. He received his Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Notre Dame in 1978 and his Juris Doctor from Duke University School of Law in 1981. Following his graduation from Duke, Judge Corrigan served as a law clerk for the Honorable Gerald B. Tjoflat of the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit and then spent 14 years in private practice.

Judge Corrigan has embraced this new opportunity to serve the judiciary and the people of the United States. One of Judge Corrigan's primary initiatives as Chief Judge is to expand the Court's communications with members of the bar and the public. In doing so, Judge Corrigan hopes to promote public awareness of the Court's role in the community, keep members of the bar up to date on Court matters, and generally increase the Court's accessibility to the public.

Judge Corrigan served as an adjunct instructor at the Duke University School of Law from 1985 to 1996

then moved on as a United States Magistrate Judge of the United States District Court for the Middle District of Florida from 1996 to 2002, and was an adjunct professor at the Florida Coastal School of Law in 1999.

◆ Judge Corrigan is one of the premier federal judges in the country, ◆ said former prosecutor Curtis Fallgatter.

Fallgatter said Judge Corrigan is smart and fair.

◆ Of course what you like when you walk in the court is a judge who treats everyone with respect and that is what you get with him," he said.

Over the years, Corrigan has been the judge in cases involving discrimination against black firefighters, a local man who attempted to go to the Middle East to join al-Qaeda and a corruption case dealing with a former Jacksonville Port Authority chairman.

Judge Corrigan isn't like all judges, either. He's been a victim.

In June 2013, Judge Corrigan was the victim of an assassination attempt. A bullet fired by Aaron Richardson, a criminal defendant whom Judge Corrigan had earlier sentenced, into Corrigan's home missed him by less than two inches, although he suffered superficial wounds from broken glass. In June 2016, Richardson was sentenced to 343 years in prison for the attempt and related charges.
