At our last meeting, Club President Becky shared an informative and stirring video about the work that Rotary (we) are doing to address water problems across the world.





When you look at this glass do you see it as half empty, or half full? When I look at this glass, I see opportunity.

An opportunity for children to attend school on a more regular basis, free of waterborne disease. An opportunity for mothers to spend more time at home caring for their family and less time carrying water for miles.
