

April is Maternal and Child Health Month

In April Rotarians celebrate Maternal and child health.

Basically, maternal health ensures that we have healthy moms raising healthy kids, but it so not quite as simple as this.

Maternal health begins with nurturing the young girl and ensuring that from an early age they have access to an education, quality health care and

gender equality.

If mothers are empowered and healthy, so are their families, which ultimately can lead to the alleviation of poverty, hunger and disease.

Rotarians around the world recognize the importance of these basic essentials and provide the help and training necessary for mothers to take control of their own health and that of their children.

We fund and support medical and dental clinics right here in Northeast Florida and have equipped a pink medical Jeep with medical supplies in Haiti so volunteers and midwives can reach mothers and children in the most remote areas.

And when local families fall under hard times, Rotary is here to help. We send backpacks filled with food home with school children for the weekend and fund and build playgrounds like with one here at the St Francis House in Gainesville. This was built by Rotaractors who visited the homeless shelter only to find children inside huddled around a tv instead of outside playing. Those Rotaractors contacted their local Rotary Clubs and with the help of a district grant built this beautiful playground so families could have a space to run and play and enjoy fun in the Florida sun.

During April and throughout the year, I invite you to Be The Inspiration to the moms and families in your community.

Jeff Hart Obituary

Jeff Hart: Hands Across the Sea



Those who have participated in recent District Conferences recall that the Rotary Youth Exchange♦s parade of flags was accompanied by John Philip Sousa♦s popular march ♦Hands Across the Sea.♦ In the words of the composer, it was ♦addressed to no particular nation, but to all of America♦s friends aboard.♦

At those occasions, Jeff Hart would introduce that parade with the quotation: �A sudden thought strikes me; let us swear eternal friendship!� With our District, Jeff best epitomized that oath of friendship. And much more.

Rotarians throughout our District are deeply saddened by the loss of Jeffrey F. Hart, charter-member and Foundation Club Chair of the Ponte Vedra Beach Sunset Club, and past District Chair of Rotary Youth Exchange (RYE).

In his role as RYE Chair, Jeff touched hundreds of lives around the world. He welcomed and supported hundreds of high school students from dozens of countries, and made the same opportunity available for our own young women and men -- representing the best of our communities, our nation • to other lands. At the 2018 District Conference, District Governor Brent Coates bestowed upon Jeff the Brent Williams Spirit of Rotary Award. Under Jeff•s leadership, the District was repeatedly recognized, internationally, with the Gold Achievement Award by the North American Youth Exchange Network.

But RYE was only one of Jeff♦s many involvements through Rotary. He was a charter member of the Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra Sunset, served as President in 2010-11, on the club♠s board of directors for many years, led the Interact and RYLA programs, and participated in countless service projects, fellowship events, and fund-raising opportunities, including Players Senior Center Rotary Pancake Breakfast (3 years), Wine Auction (2 years), Plant Sale (3 years), and Comedy 4 A Cause (2 years). Leading by example, Jeff not only made monthly personal contributions to the Rotary Foundation, but also became a Foundation Benefactor. His devotion to Service Above Self inspired numerous RYE host parents and others to not only contribute to the Foundation, but also join Rotary as members.

Over the past year, Jeff s inner strength became apparent, but only to family members and close friends. While he was undergoing treatment for a serious ailment, he persevered with his Rotary duties despite the discomfort and fatigue he endured.

A Vietnam-era US Army veteran, Jeff joined Rotary in 2004, while he was the executive for the local Belks Department Store. As he concluded his career in retail sales management, he recognized the opportunity to apply his leadership skills and knowledge through his Rotary membership.

His legacy will live on, through the Foundation s Endowment Fund, the many, many exchange students, their host families, Rotarians and others whose lives have been enriched by his tireless efforts. In Ponte Vedra Beach, and across the sea.

Rest well, dear Jeff! Your passion and leadership live on through several generations. And -- to Janeene and family -- please know that your loss is felt worldwide. Across the globe, hearts and minds share your love of Jeff and all he has done to make our world a much better place.

In leiu of flowers the Hart family requests a donation to Rotary International. Jeffrey Francis Hart was very active in the Ponte Vedra Beach Sunset Rotary club for over 15 years. Helping others and what Rotary stands for is something he believed in dearly. Rotary International is a service organization whose stated purpose is to bring people together in order to provide humanitarian services and to advance goodwill and peace around the world.
