Two of St. Johns County's finest first responders will be celebrated this Tuesday, January 31, 6:30-8pm in Nocatee. The Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra will award its Firefighter and Sheriff Deputy of the Year medals during a ceremony at the Coastal Oaks clubhouse (600 Bluewater Drive, Ponte Vedra, FL 32081).

Lieutenant Mike Pepper is the 2022 Rotary Hero Firefighter of the Year. Pepper represents St. Johns County Fire Rescue Station #18 in Nocatee. He was nominated to Lieutenant within five years of being with the department, and now has a 20-year career under his belt. Pepper is a father of four (as well as a future grandfather) and enjoys mentoring the next leaders in the department. Captain Shawn Vitori, who nominated Pepper for the award, says, "Lieutenant Pepper puts absolutely 100% into everything that he does, and does so to the highest standard."

Senior Deputy Nate Datsko is the 2022 Rotary Hero Deputy of the Year. Datsko represents the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office (SJSO) Delta Northeast sector. He's been with the SJSO since 2000 and is a 29-year veteran of law enforcement. Datsko is the father of six children, and works as a traffic homicide investigator as well as a DUI enforcement Deputy with the Traffic Unit. Nominating Sergeant Scott Yeoman says, "Senior Deputy Nate Datsko has always gone above and beyond the call of duty. He has a genuine passion for protecting our citizens."

Captains and other leaders within their respective departments nominated Pepper and Datsko for this recognition. The Rotary Heroes awards honor first responders who display excellence in their profession, high ethical standards and demonstrate the Rotary motto of "Service Above Self."










# Super Bowl Squares are Here!



We're going to try something new this year: a Super Bowl Squares fundraiser game!

# How do Super Bowl squares work?

The game starts with a 10-by-10 grid (see image to the left). Each white box in that grid has a \$10 price tag.

Before the Super Bowl kicks off, you and and/or anyone you know can buy (as many as you like) individual boxes until all 100 spaces in the grid are accounted for. The numbers 0-9 are then assigned (at random) to the (shaded) columns and rows, and each team playing in the Super Bowl is assigned to the vertical or horizontal axis. This gives each box on the grid two numbers (i.e. 5 and 7) that are attached to each football team (i.e. Chiefs and Eagles).

At the end of each quarter of the Super Bowl, a winning box is decided by what numbers and teams are attached to the score of the football game. For instance, if the Chiefs are ahead 15 to 7 over the Eagles at the end of the 1st quarter, then the box that has 5 for the Chiefs and 7 for the Eagles wins a jackpot!



### What are the jackpots?

With 100 boxes available at \$10/box, we'll have a total kitty of \$1000 from this fundraiser. Half of that kitty will go to our club's coffers. The other half (\$500) will be paid out in jackpots:

- 1st quarter jackpot = \$50
- 2nd quarter (half time) jackpot = \$75
- 3rd quarter jackpot = \$125
- 4th quarter (final score) jackpot = \$250

After tonight's NFL games are decided, club President, Bob Wiltfong, will email all club members a complete Super Bowl Squares game board (with the teams playing in the game listed on it). Please share this game with your friends and family — as it not only raises money for our club, but it makes watching the Super Bowl game a whole lot more fun! If we sell out of boxes, no problem. We can always create another board depending on demand. All payments will be collected by Bob (either by cash or his Venmo account @bob-wiltfong) and must be turned in by kick off of the Super Bowl (in two weeks). Have fun and good luck!

### **BHAG #2: Net 10 Members**

But if we really want a club Foundation that helps define Nocatee and the people who live here, we need an Endowment of \$50,000

or more. That number allows bank interest to accrue in such a way that the Foundation starts to build on itself a bit.

Where do we get roughly \$34,000 to get to that golden \$50,000 number? The answer is through corporate sponsorships of our Rubber Duck Race. The Rubber Duck Race is our club's biggest Foundation fundraiser of the year. That's why it's so important that each of us get out there and try to confirm as many corporate sponsors for the Race as possible. Simply put, without corporate sponsors for our Rubber Duck Race this year, we will not hit this BHAG and that will limit the growth and reach of our club to do good in this world.
