
Do you know who this baby is???



This Day in History



On December 4, 1783, future President George Washington, then commanding general of the Continental Army, summons his military officers to Fraunces Tavern in New York City to inform them that he will be resigning his commission and returning to civilian life. Observers described Washington as "suffused in tears" during the scene at the iconic Lower Manhattan tavern. Colonel Benjamin Tallmadge said, "After the officers had taken a glass of wine General Washington said, 'I cannot come to each of you but shall feel obliged if each of you will come and take me by the hand.' General Knox, the closest officer to Washington, walked up to the General and the two hugged and kissed with tears running down their faces."
