On April 2, the Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra will celebrate its 5th anniversary. Since its inception in 2018, the Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra has grown to about 30 members and has given over \$100,000 in donations to charitable efforts as well as volunteered thousands of hours to our community through planning meetings, committee meetings and hands-on service.

This is Kind of a Big Deal...

For the first time in club history, the Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra will be the International Sponsor Club for a Global Grant application to Rotary International. If Rotary International approves the application, we will help oversee the application of almost \$200,000 in proposed funding for the Sustainable Cambodia program!



With the help of Sustainable Cambodia founders (the Rotary Club of Gainesville), our club leaders are putting the finishing touches on a Memo of Understanding between ourselves and the Rotary Club of Pursat, Cambodia, right now to finalize a partnership on the application.

This grant proposal has several other Rotary clubs from around the country and around the world

attached to it. When you combine their donations and the potential matching funds from Rotary Districts and R.I., the \$10,000 we gathered as a club this fall for Sustainable Cambodia grows exponentially to the total mentioned above.

With that money over the next 2 years, we:

- Will help more than 500 families, more than 2000 people and several primary and secondary schools in the Pursat Province of Cambodia
- Will install water wells, ponds, rooftop water harvesting tanks, water filters and latrines for a population that the majority earns less than \$81 a month per person and two-thirds lack a clean drinking water source
