To prepare for the year, I've attended several local Rotary Leadership Institutes (RLI) this past year, the state-wide President Elect Training Seminar (PETS), and just got back from my first Rotary International Convention in Houston (recap article below).

These events have made me aware of how lucky we are to be Rotarians. We are part of a fellowship of 1.4 million dogooders around the world! The opportunities for each of us to serve, to develop as leaders, to make friends around the globe are tremendous.

I've also been exposed to so many great ideas. At each Rotary event I attended, I kept notes in a binder and circled the words "great idea" next to any idea that I found inspiring for

our club. Below are some of those "great ideas" that I look forward to sharing with you all this upcoming year.

#### **CLUB SPEAKERS**

Each week of every month will have a speaker theme that our Program Chair, Karen Everett, will try to book guests accordingly with. Those speaker themes will be:

- Personal Development (health, nutrition, finances, child rearing, retirement, etc.)
- Service Above Self (causes/organizations dedicated to less fortunate)
- Rotary Means Business (business owners, authors, inventors, entrepreneurs, media members, Rotarians sharing what they do for a living, etc.)
- Storytellers (speakers with great life stories or experiences to share)

We will embrace Zoom more often to book outstanding speakers we could never get in person at our club. Also, every couple of months we will book panels of speakers (rather than just solo guests) to encourage deeper

conversations on issues. As always, if you have a good idea for a club speaker (including yourself!), please let Karen know.

#### **MEETINGS**

Let's get more social! To that end, Karen and I will schedule at least 4 social get-togethers of the club this upcoming Rotary year and 2 membership recruiting "Happy Hours." We will mix up our meeting times every once in awhile (anyone up for an evening meeting or two?!), and look to schedule joint meetings with neighboring Rotary clubs so we can all broaden our networks.

MaryBeth has done a great job of making our club meetings more fun this year. I hope to continue that effort by adding some new features to our meetings:

- Ooh, Baby, Baby... I will share a baby photo of one of our members on a slide. The first club member to guess correctly who it is gets a free ticket in our Jack is Wild game.
- 2 Truths & 1 Lie Each month, I will share 2 Truths and 1 Lie about one of our members. If you correctly guess what the lie is, you get a free ticket in the Jack is Wild game.
- Mystery Member At one meeting each month, I will designate one of our club members to be a "Mystery Member." If you do NOT greet that Mystery Member before our meeting starts, you have to pay a fine to our Jack is Wild game.
- Rotarian of the Month Each month, I will designate one club member as our "Rotarian of the Month." At their assigned meeting, this member will stand and be praised for all that he/she does for our club. Furthermore, this person will have a designated "throne" that

they can sit in for that meeting and a bowl of grapes by their side that (anytime they ring a bell) we must feed them with.

Finally, we're going to do something called "Coffee Can Drawings." Every couple of weeks, club member names will be put into a coffee can and two random names will be drawn out. Those two people must make arrangements to share a coffee with each other over the ensuing two weeks and then report to the club what they learned about each other during the meeting.

#### **SERVICE**

One of my personal goals as President this upcoming year is to help our club apply for at least one District grant and one Global grant from Rotary International. Within our District, our Community Service Chair, Denny Baldwin, and I have been discussing two possible work projects that our club could execute this year. They are:

- Installing exercise stations (i.e. sit up benches) along some of the cart paths of Nocatee
- Installing water bottle refill stations at Davis Park

Both of these projects could allow our members to put some "sweat equity" into our service and place our Rotary wheel in high-traffic areas.

In addition, I am planning a trip (with my wife and kids) to Cambodia this upcoming March (coordinated with our kids' spring break from school) to help support and document our Water for Cambodia project over there. We're working with the Rotary



Club of Gainesville (who has been conducting Global Grant projects in Cambodia for years) and the Rotary Club of Pursat (in Cambodia) to get this done. And...our Sergeant-at-Arms, Linda Lomax, is fresh from a visit to Africa where she has identified a possible service project for us with a school in Victoria Falls (on the border of Zambia and Zimbabwe) in southern Africa.

And that, folks, are just *some* of the "great ideas" I want to share with you in the coming months! I'm excited. I hope you are too. Together, we're going to do wonderful things this year. Let's go!


Meeting Recaps
