Club Welcomes Two New Members This Tuesday









Recap of Club Assembly Recap from August 9

President Bob Wiltfong kicked off the Assembly with his "Big Hairy Audacious Goals" for the Club which include funding water re-fill stations for Davis Park and providing exercise stations along the Greenway in Nocatee. Other highlights included:

- Treasurer, Sean Smith, gave us an overview of the 2022-23 Club budget along with a report on this coming year's dues (despite inflation they'll remain the same).
- Legal Counsel, Eddie Sarnowski, reported that the 2023 Duck Race MOU awaits drafting but should be relatively simple depending on whether the Club decides to substantially follow last year's memo.
- Membership Chair, MaryBeth Murray, shared the happy news of 2 new club inductions and a membership happy hour scheduled for August 30.
- Community Service Chair, Denny Baldwin, outlined our Club's service projects for the year along with those members responsible for leading each project
- Mari Perroni, as our new Public Image Chair, updated us on a posting issue with our Club Facebook page, and a proposal to consider going with ClubRunner rather than DACdb as our club's online portal.
- Program Chair, Karen Everett, shared an update on upcoming programs and the need to establish work committees to help organize the Club's 5th anniversary next April, Rotary Heroes Awards program in January and a local teacher/student recognition program next May.
- Finally, Denny Baldwin reported on our newly created Ponte Vedra Rotary Foundation which essentially will function as the Club's philanthropic arm.
