

I was proud to see several of our club members in attendance and am happy to report we received multiple recognitions. Way to go, Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra!

As this new Rotary year gets underway, we have so many exciting opportunities in front of us. An example: for the first time ever in our club's existence, we plan to be the lead international Rotary club in a Global Grant application to Rotary International. This development will take place in

lock-step with our fundraising efforts this year for clean drinking water in Cambodia. With the blessing of organizers from the "Water for Cambodia"

effort, we will be primarily focused this year on working with the Rotary Club of Gainesville and the Rotary Club of Pursat (Cambodia) in a "Sustainable Cambodia" effort. What's the difference between "Sustainable Cambodia" and "Water for Cambodia," you ask?

Both projects work to supply clean drinking water and better education environments to some of the most impoverished people in Cambodia. Both are monitored by our fellow Rotarians in Pursat. The big differences are

"Sustainable Cambodia" does most of its work right around Pursat while "Water for Cambodia" focuses on the Siem Reap region (about 4 hours away from Pursat). Furthermore, being part of a Global Grant — with potentially dozens of other Rotary clubs from around the world dedicating money to it — allows "Sustainable Cambodia's" work at this time to address bigger projects for the long-term well being of the people we're ultimately trying to help. To me, that phrase "grow more, do more" applies.



To that end, this Tuesday's Happy Hour event can go a long way towards the long term outlook of our club. With more club members, we'll have more resources (financially and personnelwise) to do the great things we all want to do in Nocatee, our country and the world. So, if you haven't already, please invite your friends and neighbors to come to Really Good Beer this Tuesday evening and let's grow more and do more! Which reminds me of another Rotary saying that I love...If we all do a little, we can all do a lot.

So far, club members Meagan Perkins, Denny Baldwin, Bob Wiltfong, Sean Smith and Sarah Schmitt all





Recap of August Community Service

During the month of August, The Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra collected school supplies for Investing in Kids (INK). INK is the nonprofit arm of St. Johns County School District, providing the tools and resources necessary for all St. Johns County School District students to reach their potential. One of INK's flagship programs is its "Tools 4 Schools" program, which provides school supplies to teachers at Title 1 schools in St. Johns County to help fill in the gaps in school supplies for families who are unable to afford school supplies for their children.

To kick off the school supply drive, Doona Lueders, Executive Director of INK and Jim Wheeler, Operations & Student Programs Director at INK, spoke to our club about INK's "Tools 4 Schools" program and the "Take Stock in Children" program and how both programs support St. Johns County School District students in need of support and mentorship.

Our club really enjoyed the talk and plans to support INK in a mentorship capacity in the future. Club members brought school supplies to the club meeting, ordered supplies online from INK's Amazon Wish List, and dropped off school supplies at INK's donation drop off bin at Vystar Credit Union in Nocatee. Several club members have contributed to the collection.

INK is very grateful for our support. Due to rising inflation, the demand for school supplies has been much higher this year. Thank you to all of our club members who have contributed to this project!
