Tyler was active in the community and was a youth football coach. The foundation raises money for cancer research, scholarships, Advent Health Foundation, the National Marrow Donor Program, and more. Funds are raised by having a golf tournament, bar crawls, charter bus trips to Tampa Bay Rays games, Hagerty High softball games, and more. Jim Podshun is a friend of Tyler's father and arranged our program today.
