Gary Brewer led the invocation and pledge to get the meeting off on a proper note.







ADVENT HEALTH LAUNCHES HOPE & HEALING CENTER

Onward immediately to the program of Ruth Bowling and Dr. Scott Hunter from Advent Hospital bringing us up to speed on a new initiative to provide both residential and outpatient services for offenders with substance abuse issues who have been identified by Sheriff Lema of Seminole County. The alternative used to be "Go directly to Jail". This fresh approach combines a range of services to put a potential inmate back on his/her feet: everything from yoga, clothing, counselling, connection with other social agencies all the way to assistance in finding a job.

Our prisons are full of offenders for crimes that are a direct and foreseeable consequence of the underlying pathology of substance abuse. There has to be a better way than simply "lock 'em up". It costs the State something like \$30,000 per year for each of its "permanent guests". Hats off to Advent and the Sheriff for trying to a new and likely better way. Rotary might consider finding a way to add its energy and financial support to assure this program produces results. President-elect Anne already put her hand up to volunteer on-site in honor of her deceased brother.





THE PROBLEM

The misuse of and addiction to opioids— including prescription pain relievers, heroin, and synthetic opioids such as fentanyl— is a serious national crisis that affects **public health** as well as **social** and economic welfare.

This issue brings with it devastating consequences including increases in opioid misuse and related overdoses, as well as the rising incidence of neonatal abstinence syndrome due to opioid use and misuse during pregnancy. The increase in injection drug use has also contributed to the spread of infectious diseases including HIV and hepatitis C.
