Rotary Member Mentor Opportunity

We are looking for experienced Rotary members to confidently mentor our new members. A mentor plays a crucial role in guiding and supporting newer members of the organization. The Rotary mentorship program aims to help new members integrate into the Rotary community, understand its values and goals, and navigate the various aspects of Rotary service.

Typical responsibilities of a Rotary mentor:

Orientation: Mentors often provide new members with an orientation to Rotary, helping them understand the organization's history, structure, and functions.

Personal Guidance: Mentors offer personal guidance to new members, answering questions, addressing concerns, and sharing their own experiences within Rotary.

Introducing to Rotary Activities: Mentors help new members get involved in Rotary activities, projects, and events. This involvement helps newcomers feel a sense of belonging and purpose.

Networking: Mentors assist in connecting new members with other Rotary club members, fostering a sense of community and facilitating professional and personal networking.

Sharing Experience: Mentors share their own Rotary experiences, including challenges they've overcome, successes they've achieved, and lessons they've learned.

Encouragement: Mentors provide encouragement and motivation to new members, helping them stay engaged and committed to Rotary's mission of service.

Assisting with Goal Setting: Mentors may assist new members in setting personal and professional goals within the Rotary framework, encouraging growth and development.

Support During Transitions: If new members take on leadership roles or responsibilities within the club, mentors can offer support during these transitions.

CORPORATE MEMBERSHIPS

Corporate memberships would be for two persons from one business or organization to be involved in Rotary. Both persons would be members, however, only one could attend a Rotary meeting at a time on the corporate membership. If both persons wanted to attend the same meeting, one would pay the \$22 fee for lunch. The corporate membership fee would be \$1000 for two persons to rotate attending the meetings. Because each person involved with a Rotary Club must be a member of Rotary International, the Erie Club will need to pay dues to national for both members. With this plan, if one person cannot make it to a Wednesday meeting, the other person from the organization may attend. Corporate memberships were offered by the Erie Club in the past and the board voted at their February meeting to re-instate

Dear Rotary Members,

As you know, the motto of Rotarians is that we are people of action who work to make positive changes in the world. To do that, we work to raise funds and financially donate to local and international nonprofits to help them in their missions.

As a reminder, our previous donations have included:

- donating coats, toiletries, and books to the impoverished students at McKinley School in Erie
- supporting Character Be About It, a local prevention-based program taught by trained law enforcement officers to instill important character traits in students grades K-8
- supporting Shelter Box which delivers a tote with heavy tents, blankets, and supplies to devastated areas to provide temporary housing for displaced families after an earthquake or other disaster

This year, our club will host a BINGO fundraiser on Sunday, April 21, 2024, at 1pm at the JPT Events Center, 2319 West 38th Street (former Hills Store). Doors open at noon.

The reason we chose this location is that they host several bingos each week. This has become very popular. They are the experts, and they will run the game for us. We will provide marketing efforts, workers for the event, items for an auction table, and items to be raffled during the event.

This is our first year undertaking this initiative and we will need everyone's help. I ask that you consider one or more of the following ways to become involved.

- Become a sponsor by making a cash donation. There is a charge to use the facility and your support would be appreciated. Sponsorships are available in any amount.
- Make a donation of an item for the auction. We would like to have 30 items, each valued at \$100 and up. If you would like to donate a gift card or an item of lesser value, we will match your donation with another. You can also make a cash donation for an item, and we will purchase one.
- Donate a prize to be raffled during the event. Prizes for the raffles during the event can include bottles of liquor, cases of beer, designer purses, cash, or gift cards.
- Attend and invite friends and family to attend. A flyer will be sent to you via email. You can send out that flyer to friends or family via email or print it. The event will be more successful with a larger attendance, and more fun!

Tickets will be \$30 for admission and will entitle attendees to play 10 games of bingo. Each game has 9 cards on paper sheets. New players are welcome, and the venue staff will talk guests through the process. Please consider selling at least two admission tickets. You can also purchase tickets online. See the flyer for the QR code.

Your donation will help us make positive changes right here in Erie, and around the world through the support of very worthwhile causes.

We have been told some organizations can make between \$2,000- \$10,000 profit from their bingo. It all depends on the attendance. Good marketing will ensure good attendance and you can help by sharing the flyer and inviting guests to attend for a fun afternoon.

Checks can be made out to the Rotary Club of Erie and mailed to our club at PO BOX 1424, Erie PA 16512. Mark BINGO in the notes section of your check. If you want us to use your donation for a specific purpose, list that. (like BINGO AUCTION) If you just list BINGO, we will use your donation for whatever is needed most.
