We continue to have a great impact in the community and spread the good name of Rotary. You saw the pictures in the last newsletter from the satellite's efforts to gather food donations (some came from the main club too) for North Hills Cares, one of the charities that the satellite focuses on. I want to take a moment to thank all of you for the work you've done for North Hills Cares all year, and particularly for the Community of Music. Let me share some facts

with you that show the impact your work has had.

We raised over \$10,000 associated with the event, and the mail campaign is continuing to bring in donations. Proceeds are up about 12% over last year so far.

Over 1,200 food items were collected over two days, a 22% increase over last year. Much of the increase was thanks to the huge collection of food brought in by the Rich-Mar Satellite Rotary.

Participation increased from five to six school districts and an increased number of performers. This year our volunteer slots were 100% filled on both days.

So, what does this fundraising do for the community? Here are some examples from just this month:

- On Friday of last week we had a request from one of Shaler's counselors about two sisters, ages 6 and 7, lacking clothing for school. Thanks to super shopper volunteer Linda Belack, we were able to provide each girl with a week of school clothes, underwear, socks and pajamas, plus winter jackets, gloves and hats. All delivered Monday morning!
- Today I was privileged to deliver \$1,600 in Target and Giant Eagle gift cards to North Hills High School. Counselors will identify 64 students who will receive a gift card to help with Christmas.
- And this Saturday, NHC board members and our families, along with the Rich-Mar Rotary, will pack food for 60 families to help parents cover breakfasts and lunches over winter break. Here is a look at last year's project.

I hope you know how much you are valued by North Hills Cares. Wishing you and your family Happy Holidays and we look forward to seeing you in 2025!

Rotarians Support the Harvest Street Mission

On multiple occasions each year, the Rich-Mar Satellite (and a few members of the Rich-Mar Appalachia Impact Group) provide a full lunch to over 100 people on the North Side of Pittsburgh, as part of Harvest St. Mission (pictured below are all the volunteers - some beyond our Rich-Mar members). Harvest St. Mission was once called Mission from Mars, started by a dedicated woman from Mars, PA who wanted to help feed those in need each Sunday at noon. This mission has been in existence for many years now having been renamed about three years ago and now includes both the lunch and many clothing/hygiene product provisions. It is an excellent way to help those with food insecurity and in need of these other provisions. We applaud those in the club that have developed a strong partnership with Harvest St. Mission which regardless of snow, rain, sleet or sunshine provides this service 52 Sundays every year.
