The Foundation supports UPMC Passavant in McCandless and Cranberry, advancing health and wellness through education, outreach, and grant making. It is a visible extension of the Passavant legacy of caring, making the region a leader in healthcare awareness, accessibility, and quality. The Passavant Hospital Foundation was incorporated as a 501(c) 3 nonprofit foundation in 1981. Funds contributed by the community are used exclusively to develop new hospital services at UPMC Passavant in McCandless and Cranberry and to provide health, education, and outreach programming in the community.

Anthony R. Savannah joined the Foundation staff in 2014 as Director of Community Engagement, with 20 years of development, business and brand marketing, corporate and community fundraising experience. His expertise is developing business support through event fundraisers, putting the customer in front of the donor while charitable funds are being raised.? Dear Career Day Volunteers,

Thank you for taking the time to participate in our first Career Day here at the Elementary School! All the staff and students appreciate your time and are looking forward to sitting through the career presentations. Below are additional details for the day.

If you are presenting in the morning, please arrive by 9:15am. If you are presenting in the afternoon, please arrive by 1:15pm. (These times apply to all three career days) You can park in any open spot in the parking lot. There will be three thirty-minute presentations with 5 minutes in between each presentation. Mr. Lape will announce on the loudspeaker when classrooms will rotate.

Dates you can volunteer: Monday February  $12^{th}$  for  $2^{nd}$  grade, Tuesday February  $13^{th}$  for  $3^{rd}$  grade and Wednesday February  $14^{th}$  for  $4^{th}$  grade. You can sign up for one or more slots any of the given day or sign up for multiple days.

The morning time slots are as follows: 9:20-9:50, 9:55-10:25, 10:30-11:00

The afternoon time slots are as follows: 1:30-2:00, 2:05-2:35,2:40-3:10

The secretaries in the front office will scan your driver's license and give you a guest badge. You will NOT be able to participate in career day if you do not have your ID with you. The secretaries will give you a schedule and map of the school once you are scanned in the system. The schedule will state the classrooms you will be presenting to and the location you will be going to for the presentations. You will stay in one location and the classrooms will rotate to you. Classroom teachers will be present with their classrooms throughout the presentation. Each classroom has approximately 25 students if you plan on bringing supplies to hand out. Each classroom has a ViewSonic board so you can connect to a computer if needed.
