



On March 5 the World Affairs Council of Pittsburgh, in cooperation with Rotary International and Sustainable Pittsburgh, will host the "53rd Annual World Affairs Institute: Navigating Climate Intersections.†There will be two tracks - one for adults and one for youths. Our club has contacted the local high schools about Rich-Mar paying for several students/teachers to attend the "Youth Changemakers" track. This will be the subject of our February 7 program.
