Alicia Cagle joined the Council in June 2023 as the Youth Programming Manager. After her term of service with AmeriCorps, Alicia transitioned to a role as a project coordinator with the Arab Studies Institute (ASI) based in Washington, DC and Beirut, Lebanon. At ASI, Alicia was responsible for planning international conferences and managing research related to the representation of the Middle East and North Africa in cyberspace.

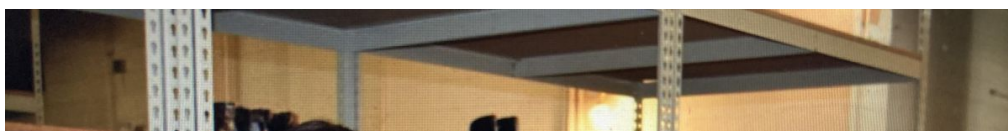

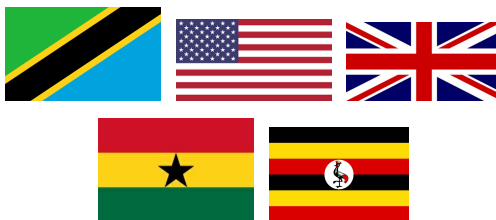

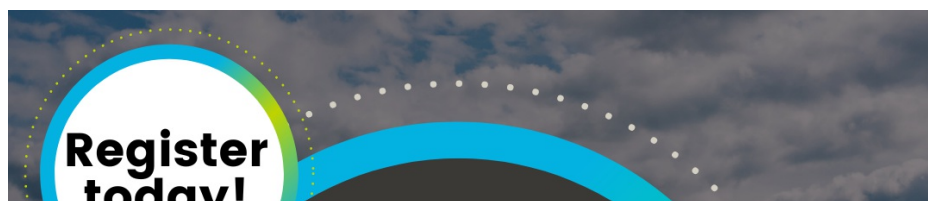
