Ron Gigler introduced Melanie and David Sturrock that took over duties for the Shelter Box, they hail from the Rich Mar Rotary. Tom and Marie passed and so Melanie and David took up the torch. Dave brought up examples, such as refugees from Ukraine, of providing shelter after disaster to provide a place to sleep. Shelter Box has helped over 2.5 million people in the past 12 years. Dave may bring tent to community days. Melanie showed us the solar power light and Dave demonstrated - this provides safety and normalacy to their families, as well as provide a usb port for charging phones to provide communication. Mosquito nets and water purification - the old one did 300 gallons – the new filter has 52,000 gallon filter capacity- another example of innovation at work. Sometimes you just need to repair what you have - shelter kits to repair homes. This is used more in urban areas. Sometimes financial aid is provided to help rebuild their homes. 5 warehouses Philippines, Panama, UK etc where shelter boxes are stored for disasters. Stock the box campaign running now. Rotarians are usually community leaders and the network helps reach those in need. Rotary trains local leaders and months later they return to see what they can do better.
