\$4846 from speakeasy proceeds and registrations of \$601 for district conference.

\$1,500 dollars of expenses for speakeasy – we incur monthly costs \$105 for storage, \$42 student of month, \$320 for meeting expenses for month – our bank account grew by \$10,000 this month due to hard work and areas here.

Shawn reviewed the speakeasy event income and costs – total revenue \$6,185 – that included \$1,600 of sponsorship mainly from Butler County Tourism. The net was just over \$4,000 not including 50% we are setting aside to give to the Elks.
