## 07.31.24 Rotary Meeting

### Beaver Rotary Meeting Notes: July 31, 2024

*Let it be known that we had carrot cake for a change of dessert!*

#### Opening

Grant filled in for Mirko and began meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance, the 4-way Test, and Dan did the prayer.

Grant reported the \$1,420.91 Rotary International Invoice.

He also said the Transition dinner was great and thanked everyone for a nice "send-off."

#### Bed Update (Hank)

Hank reported that two more beds were delivered bringing us up to 503 beds. He also asked that the application form be posted online.

#### Expanding Rotary Projects (community based)

Hank offered a possible Community-based Rotary Project: A Walk Audit for the community. He hopes that Rotary will sponsor the program and provide volunteers. The initiative assesses the walkways (primarily 3<sup>rd</sup> St) for safety and "walkability." Hank's daughter hopes to administer the program but needs support, and is turning to Rotary for that support.

Vic explained that he is concerned with the RI grant not being given because the Bed Program is submitted year after year. He believes we will be ok for the coming year but encouraged us to come up with more community-based projects in case the Bed Project is declined.

#### Sponsorship Initiative (Harry)

Harry presented a canvas sign with all the sponsors listed on sign. Very nice! (editorial comment) He gave the sign to Chris who will set up booth for the Antique Car Cruise.

#### Antique Car Cruise Booth

A booth will be set up by Chris who will bring table, Rotary sign, Sponsor sign, water (supplied by George and a cooler for the water. Also, a flyer for cornhole tournament is being completed by George's wife with updated date, cash prizes and time. (The QR code doesn't need to be changed for the Eventbrite page.) The three volunteers for the booth are Chris, Alicia and Mirko. Though it wasn't specified, I believe the charge for the water will be .50. There should also be sign-ups for Rotary as well.

#### Cornhole Tournament (Chris)

The tournament is set up for Conway Volunteer Fire Company Hall on Oct. 5<sup>th</sup> from 2pm to 6pm. Eventbrite, as before, is managing ticket sales. \$50 for teams and \$25 for individuals. #### Pickle Ball Tournament (Vic)

It's been suggested that a pickleball tournament be held in the Winter months (Jan/Feb) at Brady's Run Park. They have indoor (2) and outdoor courts (3). Being that it is winter, we will only be able to use indoor courts, which is limiting. It was suggested that we investigate M7 Sports Complex which will be opening soon. There was much support from the group to pursue this tournament.


#### Flags for Heros (update by George)

George reported that thank-you emails were sent out to all participants. George needs an address for Vietnam Vets to send money collected for veterans. This year was the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest number of flags ever with 22 more flags than last year.

Alicia reported that she contributed \$300 to the Bed Program through the dunking booth sponsored by the officers of her bank, Hancock County Savings Bank.

#### Website (Dan)

Dan volunteered to explore the possibility of an EZ Website through DACdb.



The cost for this is \$433 for the first year because of setup fees, and \$334 annually. Some of the advantages of the EZ Website are the ease of design set-up, support from MenderMinder Pro (owner of DACdb), automated forms, and anyone can maintain the website (There should be 2 or 3 persons from the club who can maintain the website) and finally, the cost is more than reasonable for all the services rendered.
